5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 55A-7-24(a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a) Unless the articles of incorporation or bylaws prohibit or limit proxy voting, a
8	member may vote in person or by proxy. A member may appoint a proxy one or more
9	proxies to vote or otherwise act for him by signing an appointment form, either
10	personally or by his attorney-in-fact. A telegram, telex, facsimile, or other form of wire or
11	wireless communication appearing to have been transmitted by a member, or a photocopy
12	photocopy, telegram, cablegram, facsimile transmission, or equivalent reproduction of a
13	writing appointing one or more proxies, shall be deemed a valid appointment form within
14	the meaning of this section. In addition, if and to the extent permitted by the nonprofit
15	corporation, a member may appoint one or more proxies (i) by an electronic mail
16	message or other form of electronic, wire, or wireless communication that provides a
17	written statement appearing to have been sent by the member, or (ii) by any kind of
18	electronic or telephonic transmission, even if not accompanied by written
19	communication, under circumstances or together with information from which the

- 1 nonprofit corporation can reasonably assume that the appointment was made or
- 2 <u>authorized by the member.</u>"
- 3 Section 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1999.
