The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 18B-302 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:		
	audulent Possession of Identification. – It shall be unlawful for	

to possess or to display fraudulent identification, as defined in subdivisions (e)(1) through (e)(4) of this section, while attempting to obtain alcoholic beverages or while attempting to obtain or obtaining permission to purchase alcoholic beverages from a permittee."

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2001, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
