A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW REGARDING THE ISSUANCE OF ABC PERMITS TO RESIDENTIAL PRIVATE CLUBS AND SPORTS CLUBS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction holds that G.S. 18B-1006(k), as rewritten by Chapter 466 of the 1995 Session Laws and amended by Session Law 1999-462, is unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, and that decision is not reversed, then G.S. 18B-1006(k) reads as rewritten:

- "(k) Residential Private Club and Sports Club Permits. The Commission may issue the permits listed in G.S. 18B-1001, without approval at an election, to a residential private club or a sports <u>club</u>. elub that is located in a county that meets the requirements set in any of the following subdivisions:
 - (1) Has a population of less than 45,000 by the last federal census, has at least three but not more than four cities that have approved the sale of malt beverages or unfortified wine, has only one city that has approved the on premises sale of malt beverages, and has at least two cities that approved the operation of ABC stores before July 10, 1992.
 - (2) Borders a county that has called elections pursuant to G.S. 18B-600(f), and:
 - a. Has not approved the issuance of permits, other than malt beverage permits, in unincorporated areas of the county, and has no more than three cities that approved the operation of ABC stores before July 10, 1992; or
 - b. Both the county and the two cities within the county have approved the operation of ABC stores.
 - (3) Is bordered by four counties that have not approved the issuance of permits and have at least one city that has approved the operation of an ABC store.

1	(4)	Has not approved the issuance of permits, has at least three cities that
2		have approved the issuance of only either off premises malt beverage
3		or both off-premises malt beverage and off-premises unfortified wine
4		permits, and has only one city that, as of July 1, 1993, had approved
5		the operation of an ABC store.
6	(5)	Has not approved the issuance of any permits, borders one of the two
7		largest counties in the State with more than 940 square miles, has an
8		interstate highway running through it, and has at least six cities that
9		have approved the sale of some malt beverages and unfortified wine
10		and four of which have approved ABC systems.
11	(6)	Borders a county that has approved the issuance of all permits and the
12		operation of an ABC store, meets the county description of a special
13		ABC area in G.S. 18B-101(13a)b., and, as of July 1, 1995, had at least
14		five cities that had authorized the issuance of permits.
15	(7)	Borders two states and, as of July 1, 1995, had only one city that had
16		approved the issuance of permits.
17	(8)	Has an 18 hole golf course; is in the coastal area as defined in G.S.
18		113A 103, but only because it is adjacent to, adjoining, intersected by,
19		or bounded by a coastal sound; which does not allow countywide sales
20		of mixed beverages; which does not border another state; with a
21		population of less than 15,000 according to the most recent decennial
22		federal census; which does not have a city which has authorized the
23		sale of mixed beverages; and which has least two cities with ABC
24		systems.
25	The mixed b	beverages purchase-transportation permit authorized by G.S. 18B-404(b)
26	shall be issued by a local board operating a store located in the county."	

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SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
