6	SEC	FION 1. G.S. 96-9 (a)(8) reads as rewritten:
7	"(8)	An employer of domestic service employees as defined by the Internal
8		<u>Revenue Code</u> who has filed reports with the Commission for at least
9		three consecutive years and has not been liable for quarterly
10		contributions under subdivision (6) of this subsection during the
11		preceding calendar year may be given permission by the Chair of the
12		Commission to file reports once a year on or before the last day of the
13		month following the close of the calendar year in which the wages are
14		paid. Permission to file a report annually may be revoked if the
15		employer is found liable to the Commission for quarterly contributions
16		under subdivision (6) of this subsection.
17		An employer who is granted permission to file annual reports must
18		comply with 20 C.F.R. § 603.21 so that reporting of wages and
19		employment status are as effective and timely as the quarterly wage
20		reporting system. This compliance includes the reporting of all
21		changes in employment status and in wages of an employee to the
22		Commission within 14 days of the occurrence and responding to all
23		inquiries from the Commission as to wages paid to an employee in a
24		year in which the employer is reporting on an annual basis within 14
25		days of the postmark of the inquiry. If an employer does not report or
26		respond to an inquiry within 14 days, then the Commission will
27		estimate wages paid to an employee based on the last report the
28		employer filed with the Commission, and the employer will be liable

1	for any charge based on the Commission's estimation of the wages
2	paid to the employee."
3	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
