1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO ESTABLISH AN ADDITIONAL  
3 ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY POSITION IN PROSECUTORIAL  
4 DISTRICT EIGHT TO ALLOW FOR THE ASSIGNMENT OF SENIOR  
5 ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEYS TO THE FAMILY COURT PILOT IN  
6 THAT DISTRICT.

7 Whereas, the Eighth Prosecutorial District is serving as a pilot family court  
8 district as recommended by the Commission for the Future of Justice and the Courts in  
9 North Carolina, in an effort to bring consistency, efficiency, and fairness to the  
10 resolution of family and juvenile justice matters; and

11 Whereas, in order to function in the manner foreseen by the Commission, the  
12 family court pilot needs to have senior assistant district attorneys assigned to it; and

13 Whereas, the number of full-time assistant district attorney positions  
14 established for the Eighth Prosecutorial District is proving to be insufficient to allow for  
15 those senior assistant district attorneys' assignment to family court without the sacrifice  
16 of other prosecutorial duties in the District; Now, therefore,

17 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

18 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 7A-60(a1) reads as rewritten:

19 "(a1) The counties of the State are organized into prosecutorial districts, and each  
20 district has the counties and the number of full-time assistant district attorneys set forth  
21 in the following table:

7           **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial  
8 Department the sum of eighty-one thousand eight hundred thirty-two dollars (\$81,832)  
9 for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the sum of seventy-five thousand three hundred thirty  
10 dollars (\$75,330) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year to establish the assistant district attorney  
11 position authorized by this act.

12           **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.
