1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REVISE AND CONSOLIDATE THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF
3	PRINCETON.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. The Charter of the Town of Princeton is revised and
6	consolidated to read as follows:
7	"THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF PRINCETON.
8	"ARTICLE I. INCORPORATION, CORPORATE POWERS, AND BOUNDARIES.
9	"Section 1.1. Incorporation. The Town of Princeton in the County of Johnston, and
10	the inhabitants thereof, shall continue to be a municipal body politic and corporate,
11	under the name and style of the 'Town of Princeton,' hereinafter at times referred to as
12	the 'Town'.
13	"Section 1.2. Powers. The Town of Princeton shall have and may exercise all of the
14	powers, duties, rights, privileges, and immunities, which are now, or hereafter may be
15	conferred, either expressly or by implication, upon the Town of Princeton, specifically,
16	or upon municipal corporations, generally, by this Charter, by the North Carolina
17	Constitution, or by general or local law.
18	"Section 1.3. Corporate Limits. The corporate limits of the Town of Princeton shall
19	be those existing at the time of ratification of this Charter, as the same are set forth on
20	the official map of the Town, and as the same may be altered from time to time in
21	accordance with law. An official map or description showing the current Town
22	boundaries shall be maintained permanently in the office of the Town Clerk, and shall
23	be available for public inspection. Immediately upon alteration of the corporate limits
24	made pursuant to law, the appropriate changes to the official map or description of the
25	Town shall be made.
26	"ARTICLE II. MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.
27	"Section 2.1. Governing Body. The Mayor and Board of Commissioners, elected
28	and constituted as herein set forth, shall be the governing body of the Town. On behalf

29 of the Town, and in conformity with applicable laws, the Mayor and Board may provide

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for the exercise of all municipal powers, and shall be charged with the general
 government of the Town.

"Section 2.2. Board of Commissioners; Composition; Terms of Office. The
Board of Commissioners shall be composed of four members, each of whom shall be
elected for terms of four years in the manner provided by Article III of this Charter,
provided, they shall serve until their successors are elected and qualified.

"Section 2.3. Election of the Mayor; Term of Office; Duties. The Mayor shall be 7 8 elected by voters of the Town in the manner provided by Article III of this Charter for a 9 term of two years; provided, the Mayor shall serve until his successor is elected and 10 qualified. The Mayor shall be the official head of the Town government and shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Commissioners. He shall have the right to vote 11 12 only if there are equal numbers of votes in the affirmative and the negative on any 13 matter before the Board. The Mayor shall exercise such powers and perform such duties 14 as presently are or hereafter may be conferred upon him by the General Statutes, by this 15 Charter, and by the ordinances of the Town.

"Section 2.4 Mayor Pro Tempore. In accordance with applicable State laws, the Board of Commissioners shall appoint one of its members to act as Mayor Pro Tempore to perform the duties of the Mayor in the Mayor's absence or disability. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Mayor, the Mayor Pro Tempore shall perform the duties of the Mayor until the vacancy is filled. The Mayor Pro Tempore as such shall have no fixed term of office, but shall serve in such capacity at the pleasure of the remaining members of the Board.

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#### "ARTICLE III. ELECTIONS.

"Section 3. 1. Regular Municipal Elections; Conduct and Method of Election.
Regular municipal elections shall be held in the Town every two years in odd-numbered
years, and shall be conducted in accordance with the uniform municipal election laws of
North Carolina. The Mayor and members of the Board of Commissioners shall be
elected according to the nonpartisan plurality method of election, as provided by G.S.
164-292.

"Section 3.2. Election of the Board of Commissioners; Election of Mayor. At the
 regular municipal election in 2003 and every two years thereafter, there shall be elected
 two Commissioners and a Mayor to fill the seats of the Commissioners and Mayor
 whose terms are then expiring.

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#### "ARTICLE IV. ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION.

"Section 4.1. Form of Government. The Town shall operate under the
Mayor-Board of Commissioners form of government, in accordance with Part 3 of
Article 7 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes.

38 "Section 4.2. Town Attorney. The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a Town 39 Attorney who shall be licensed to engage in the practice of law in the State of North 40 Carolina. It shall be the duty of the Town Attorney to prosecute and defend suits against 41 the Town and to advise the Mayor, Board of Commissioners and other Town officials 42 with respect to the affairs of the Town.

43 "Section 4.3. Town Clerk. The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a Town
44 Clerk to keep a journal of the proceedings of the Board, to maintain in a safe place all

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records and documents pertaining to the affairs of the Town, and to perform such other
 duties as may be required by law or as the Board of Commissioners may direct.

3 "Section 4.4. **Town Tax Collector.** The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a 4 Town Tax Collector to collect all taxes, licenses, fees, and other moneys belonging to 5 the Town, subject to the General Statutes, the provisions of this Charter and the 6 ordinances of the Town. The Town Tax Collector shall diligently comply with and 7 enforce all the laws of North Carolina relating to the collection of taxes by 8 municipalities.

9 "Section 4.5. Town Finance Officer. The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a
10 Town Treasurer or Finance Officer to perform the duties of the finance officer as
11 required by the Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act, and to perform such
12 other duties as may be required by the Board.

13 "Section 4.6. Consolidation of Functions. The Board of Commissioners may 14 consolidate any two or more positions of Town Clerk, Town Tax Collector, and Town 15 Finance Officer, or may assign the functions of any one or more of these positions to the 16 holder or holders of any other of these positions, subject to the Local Government 17 Budget and Fiscal Control Act.

18 "Section 4.7. Other Administrative Officers and Employees. Consistent with 19 applicable State laws, the Board of Commissioners may establish other positions, 20 provide for the appointment of other administrative officers and employees, and 21 generally organize the Town government in order to promote the orderly and efficient 22 administration of the affairs of the Town."

SECTION 2. The purpose of this act is to revise the Charter of the Town of
 Princeton and to consolidate herein certain acts concerning the property, affairs, and
 government of the Town.

SECTION 3. The following acts or portions of acts, having served the purposes for which they were enacted, or having been consolidated into this act, are hereby repealed:

- 38 **SECTION 4.** No provision of this act is intended, nor shall be construed, to 39 affect in any way, any rights or interests (whether public or private):
- 40 (1) Now vested or accrued, in whole or in part, the validity of which might
  41 be sustained or preserved by reference to any provisions of law
  42 repealed by this act;

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(2) Derived from, or which might be sustained or preserved in reliance
upon, action heretofore taken pursuant to or within the scope of any
provisions of law repealed by this act.
<b>SECTION 5.</b> No law heretofore repealed expressly or by implication, and no
law granting authority which has been exhausted, shall be revived by:
(1) The repeal herein of any act repealing such law, or
(2) Any provision of this act that disclaims an intention to repeal or affect
enumerated or designated laws.
SECTION 6. All existing ordinances and resolutions of the Town of
Princeton and all existing rules or regulations of departments or agencies of the Town of
Princeton, not inconsistent with the provisions of this act, shall continue in full force
and effect until repealed, modified, or amended.
SECTION 7. No action or proceeding of any nature (whether civil or
criminal, judicial or administrative, or otherwise) pending at the effective date of this
act by or against the Town of Princeton or any of its departments or agencies, shall be
abated or otherwise affected by the adoption of this act.
<b>SECTION 8.</b> If any of this act or the application thereof to any person or
circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
applications of this act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or
application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.
SECTION 9. Whenever a reference is made in this act to a particular
provision of the General Statutes, and such provision is later amended, repealed or
superseded, the reference shall be deemed amended to refer to the amended General
Statute, or to the General Statute which most nearly corresponds to the statutory
provision, which is repealed or superseded.
<b>SECTION 10.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
