(3) One member appointed by the General Assembly, upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, who is a member of the general public.

Members of the Board shall serve staggered three-year terms, ending on June 30 of the last year of the term or when a successor has been duly appointed, whichever is later. No member may serve more than two complete consecutive terms.

- (c) Qualifications. Members appointed by the Governor shall hold a license issued by the Board and shall be engaged in full-time employment in this State in a practice authorized by his or her license. Public members shall not be licensed under this Article or employed by a person who is licensed under this Article.
- (d) <u>Vacancies.</u> A vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment, except that all unexpired terms of Board members appointed by the General Assembly shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Appointees to fill vacancies shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term and until their successors have been duly appointed and qualified.
- (e) Removal. The Board may remove any of its members for neglect of duty, incompetence, or unprofessional conduct. A member subject to disciplinary proceedings as a licensee shall be disqualified from participating in the official business of the Board until the charges have been resolved."

**SECTION 3.** The two members most recently elected to the Board of Mortuary Science and serving on the Board on the effective date of this act shall complete their current terms. To establish staggered terms of the members of the Board of Mortuary Science pursuant to G.S. 90-210.18A(b), three members recommended by the North Carolina Funeral Directors Association, Inc., shall serve two-year terms, and two members recommended by that Association shall serve three-year terms. One member recommended by the Funeral Directors & Morticians Association of North Carolina, Inc., shall serve a two-year term, and one member recommended by that Association shall serve a three-year term. The General Assembly, upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, shall appoint one member for a one-year term, and the General Assembly, upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, shall appoint one member for a one-year term. After the staggered terms have been established, members appointed to the Board thereafter shall serve three-year terms.

**SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
