6	SEC	TION 1.(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 12	2 of Chapter
7	160A of the General Statutes, the following procedures may be utilized by the City of		
8	Goldsboro relative to the sale of surplus real property owned alone by the City or jointly		
9	owned by the City and by Wayne County.		
10	SECTION 1.(b) Substandard surplus real property may be disposed of under		
11	the following procedures:		
12	(1)	The City Clerk will notify the Planning and Community I	Development
13		Department of the City's receipt of substandard surplus pr	operty.
14	(2)	The Planning and Community Development Department	will identify
15		all contiguous property owners.	
16	(3)	The Planning and Community Development Depa	rtment will
17		determine if any of the adjoining parcels are substandard.	
18	(4)	If only one of the adjacent lots is substandard, the owner	er of that lot
19		will be deeded the City's surplus lot if the owner elects	in writing to
20		receive title to the property in return for one dollar (\$1.00)	
21	(5)	If more than one adjoining parcel to the surplus	property is
22		substandard, the Planning and Community Development	Department
23		will contact these property owners to determine their	r interest in
24		receiving the substandard lot. If more than one adjoin	ing property
25		owner elects in writing to receive title to a portion of the	substandard
26		lot, the property will be divided in order to create t	wo standard
27		adjoining lots.	

(6) If dividing the substandard lot among adjoining property owners does 1 2 not create two standard lots, ownership of the entire lot will be 3 awarded to the owner of the adjoining lot with the greater degree of a substandard condition. If not accepted by this adjoining owner, then 4 the lot will be awarded to the other adjoining owner. 5 6 (7) If the property adjacent to a substandard lot is standard in nature, the 7 property will be divided among the adjoining property owners. If only 8 one adjoining standard property owner shows interest in the standard 9 lot, full property ownership will be awarded to this owner. 10 **SECTION 1.(c)** Standard surplus real property may be disposed of under the following procedures: 11 12 The City Clerk will notify the Planning and Community Development (1) Department of the City's receipt of standard real surplus property. 13 14 (2) The Planning and Community Development Department will identify 15 all contiguous property owners. 16 (3) The Planning and Community Development Department will 17 determine if any of the adjoining parcels are substandard. 18 (4) If a substandard lot adjoins a standard City surplus lot and the property owner agrees to pay fifty percent (50%) of the tax value of the surplus 19 20 lot, this lot will be sold to the owner of the substandard lot at this price 21 without soliciting further additional bids. If more than one adjoining property is substandard and both property 22 (5) owners are willing to share in the minimum asking price of fifty 23 24 percent (50%) of the total property tax value of the standard lot, the lot in question will then be subdivided between the two adjoining property 25 owners of substandard lots without soliciting further bids provided this 26 27 division creates two standard lots. If not accepted by this adjoining owner, then the lot will be awarded to the other adjoining owner. 28 29 When all adjacent lots are standard in nature, the Finance Department (6) 30 will conduct the sale of the standard surplus lot. Standard surplus lots will be offered for sale in accordance with the provisions of 31 32 G.S. 160A-266, provided however, the minimum sales price will be at 33 least fifty percent (50%) of the property's tax value. No bid for the lot under fifty percent (50%) of the property's tax value may be accepted 34 35 by the City council. **SECTION 2.** When selling standard properties, the City of Goldsboro will at 36 37 a minimum: 38 (1) Notify the adjacent property owners and individuals and entities who 39 have bid on surplus property in the past as well as all local real estate firms. 40 Place upon the property a "For Sale" sign. 41 (2)

Place a nonlegal advertisement in a local newspaper.

on a local radio station and PACC 10 TV.

Arrange for the broadcast of at least one public service announcement
