AN ACT TO CREATE THE OFFENSE OF SEXUAL BATTERY.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. G.S. 14-27.1 reads as rewritten:
"§ 14-27.1. Definitions.
As used in this Article, unless the context requires otherwise:
(5) 'Sexual contact' means (i) touching the sexual organ, anus, breas
groin, or buttocks of any person, or (ii) a person touching anoth
person with their own sexual organ, anus, breast, groin, or buttocks.
(6) Touching as used in subdivision (5) of this section, means physic
contact with another person, whether accomplished directly, through
the clothing of the person committing the offense, or through the
clothing of the victim."
SECTION 2. Article 7 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by
adding a new section to read:
"§ 14-27.5A. Sexual battery.
(a) A person is guilty of sexual battery if the person, for the purpose of sexual battery if the person is guilty
arousal, sexual gratification, or sexual abuse, engages in sexual contact with anoth
person:
(1) By force and against the will of the other person; or
(2) Who is mentally disabled, mentally incapacitated, or physical
helpless, and the person performing the act knows or shou
reasonably know that the other person is mentally disabled, mental
incapacitated, or physically helpless.
(b) Any person who commits the offense defined in this section is guilty of
Class A1 misdemeanor."
SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies
offenses committed on or after that date.
