BILL SUMMARY: The bill increases the number of representatives from one to two on the Indian Cultural Center Board for the Lumbees of Robeson, Hoke, and Scotland Counties, and the Waccamaw-Siouan from Columbus and Bladen Counties. The bill would also require the members from the education and business communities, and from State government, to reside in specified counties.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY: The Indian Cultural Center Board is a non-profit organization. The Board currently has 17 members and this bill adds two additional members and specifies the counties from which certain members must reside. The North Carolina Commission of Indian Affairs appoints members to the Indian Cultural Center Board, but has no administrative oversight of the organization. Therefore, this bill will have no fiscal impact on the Commission of Indian Affairs housed in the Department of Administration.
