The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
SECTION 1. Chapter 71A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a		
new section to read:		
"§ 71A-7.3. Nottoway Tribal Community; rights, privileges, immunities,		
obligations, and duties.		
The Indians now residing in Hertford, Bertie, Gates, Northampton, and Martin		
Counties, who are lineal descendants of certain tribes of Indians, who originally		
inhabited areas along the Nottoway River in southeastern Virginia in precontact times		
shall, from and after July 20, 1971, be designated and officially recognized as the		
Nottoway Tribal Community of North Carolina, shall continue to enjoy all their rights,		
privileges, and immunities as citizens of the State as now or hereafter provided by law,		
and shall continue to be subject to all the obligations and duties of citizens under the		
law."		

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
