12		manufacturing process, from the shipping of goods, or from the			
13		construction, remodeling, or repair of a residential or commercial			
14		structure or building that is free from adhesive glue, paint, stain, fire			
15		retardant, pesticide, sealant, and is not treated with a chemical			
16		preservative. Clean wood waste does not include any wooden material			
17		physically attached to a nonwood material.

19	<u>(6a)</u>	'Electronic device' means a computer central processing unit whether			
20		sold alone or with accessories; computer monitor; laptop computer;			
21		and television with a video display that has a viewable area greater			
22		than nine inches when measured diagonally.

25		diagnosis, treatment, or immunization of human beings or animals, in			
26		research pertaining thereto, or in the production or testing of

2			defined in 40 Code of Federal Regulations § 261.4(b)(1) in effect on 1
