A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND THE ALLOCATION OF FUNDS AND CONTRIBUTION  
COMMITMENTS FOR THE DISTINGUISHED PROFESSOR ENDOWMENT  
TRUST FUND AND THE SUM REQUIRED TO ESTABLISH AN ENDOWED  
CHAIR.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 116-41.15 reads as rewritten:

**"§ 116-41.15. Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund; allocation;  
administration.**

(a) For constituent institutions other than focused growth institutions and special  
needs institutions, the amount appropriated to the trust shall be allocated by the Board  
as follows:

- (1) On the basis of one three hundred thirty-four thousand dollar  
(\$334,000) challenge grant for each six hundred sixty-six thousand  
dollars (\$666,000) raised from private sources; or
- (2) On the basis of one hundred sixty-seven thousand dollar (\$167,000)  
challenge grant for each three hundred thirty-three thousand dollars  
(\$333,000) raised from private ~~sources.~~ sources; or
- (3) On the basis of one challenge grant of up to one million dollars  
(\$1,000,000) for funds raised from private sources in twice the amount  
of the challenge grant.

If an institution chooses to pursue the use of the allocated challenge grant funds  
described in either subdivision ~~(1)~~(1), ~~or~~ subdivision ~~(2)~~(2), or subdivision (3) of this  
subsection, the challenge grant funds shall be matched by funds from private sources on  
~~a two to one basis.~~ the basis of two dollars (\$2.00) of private funds for every one dollar  
(\$1.00) of State funds.

1 (b) For focused growth institutions and special needs institutions, the amount  
2 appropriated to the trust shall be allocated by the Board as follows:

3 (1) On the basis of one five hundred thousand dollar (\$500,000) challenge  
4 grant for each five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) raised from  
5 private sources; or

6 (2) On the basis of one two hundred fifty thousand dollar (\$250,000)  
7 challenge grant for each two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)  
8 raised from private sources; ~~or If an institution chooses to~~  
9 ~~pursue the use of the allocated challenge grant funds described in~~  
10 ~~either subdivision (1) or subdivision (2) of this subsection, the funds~~  
11 ~~shall be matched on a one-to-one basis.~~

12 (3) On the basis of one challenge grant of up to one million five hundred  
13 thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) for funds raised from private sources in  
14 the same amount as the challenge grant.

15 If an institution chooses to pursue the use of the allocated challenge grant funds  
16 described in either subdivision (1), subdivision (2), or subdivision (3) of this subsection,  
17 the challenge grant funds shall be matched by funds from private sources on the basis of  
18 one dollar (\$1.00) of private funds for every one dollar (\$1.00) of State funds.

19 (c) Matching funds shall come from contributions made after July 1, 1985, and  
20 pledged for the purposes specified by G.S. 116-41.14. Each participating constituent  
21 institution's board of trustees shall establish its own Distinguished Professors  
22 Endowment Trust Fund, and shall maintain it pursuant to the provision of G.S. 116-36  
23 to function as a depository for private contributions and for the State matching funds for  
24 the challenge grants. The State matching funds shall be transferred to the constituent  
25 institution's Endowment Fund upon notification that the institution has received and  
26 deposited the appropriate amount required by this section in its own Distinguished  
27 Professors Endowment Trust Fund. Only the net income from that account shall be  
28 expended in support of the distinguished professorship thereby created."

29 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 116-41.16 reads as rewritten:

30 "**§ 116-41.16. Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund; contribution**  
31 **commitments.**

32 (a) For constituent institutions other than focused growth institutions and special  
33 needs institutions, contributions may also be eligible for matching if there is:

34 (1) A commitment to make a donation of at least six hundred sixty-six  
35 thousand dollars (\$666,000), as prescribed by G.S. 143-31.4, and an  
36 initial payment of one hundred eleven thousand dollars (\$111,000) to  
37 receive a grant described in G.S. 116-41.15(a)(1); or

38 (2) A commitment to make a donation of at least three hundred  
39 thirty-three thousand dollars (\$333,000), as prescribed by  
40 G.S. 143-31.4, and an initial payment of fifty-five thousand five  
41 hundred dollars (\$55,500) to receive a grant described in  
42 G.S. 116-41.15(a)(2); ~~or and if the initial payment is accompanied by a~~  
43 ~~written pledge to provide the balance within five years after the date of~~  
44 ~~the initial payment. Each payment on the balance shall be no less than~~

1           ~~the amount of the initial payment and shall be made on or before the~~  
2           ~~anniversary date of the initial payment. Pledged contributions may not~~  
3           ~~be matched prior to the actual collection of the total funds. Once the~~  
4           ~~income from the institution's Distinguished Professors Endowment~~  
5           ~~Trust Fund can be effectively used pursuant to G.S. 116-41.17, the~~  
6           ~~institution shall proceed to implement plans for establishing an~~  
7           ~~endowed chair.~~

- 8           (3) A commitment to make a donation in excess of six hundred sixty-six  
9           thousand dollars (\$666,000), as prescribed by G.S. 143-31.4, and an  
10           initial payment of one-sixth of the committed amount to receive a  
11           grant described in G.S. 116-41.15(a)(3);

12 and if the initial payment is accompanied by a written pledge to provide the balance  
13 within five years after the date of the initial payment. Each payment on the balance shall  
14 be no less than the amount of the initial payment and shall be made on or before the  
15 anniversary date of the initial payment. Pledged contributions may not be matched prior  
16 to the actual collection of the total funds. Once the income from the institution's  
17 Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund can be effectively used pursuant to  
18 G.S. 116-41.17, the institution shall proceed to implement plans for establishing an  
19 endowed chair.

20       (b) For focused growth institutions and special needs institutions, contributions  
21 may also be eligible for matching if there is:

- 22       (1) A commitment to make a donation of at least five hundred thousand  
23       dollars (\$500,000), as prescribed by G.S. 143-31.4, and an initial  
24       payment of eighty-three thousand three hundred dollars (\$83,300) to  
25       receive a grant described in G.S. 116-41.5(b)(1); or

- 26       (2) A commitment to make a donation of at least two hundred fifty  
27       thousand dollars (\$250,000), as prescribed by G.S. 143-31.4, and an  
28       initial payment of forty-one thousand six hundred dollars (\$41,600) to  
29       receive a grant described in G.S. 116-41.15(b)(2); ~~and if the initial~~  
30       ~~payment is accompanied by a written pledge to provide the balance~~  
31       ~~within five years after the date of the initial payment. Each payment on~~  
32       ~~the balance shall be no less than the amount of the initial payment.~~  
33       ~~Pledged contributions may not be matched prior to the actual~~  
34       ~~collection of the total funds. Once the income from the institution's~~  
35       ~~Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund can be effectively~~  
36       ~~used pursuant to G.S. 116-41.17, the institution shall proceed to~~  
37       ~~implement plans for establishing an endowed chair.~~

- 38       (3) A commitment to make a donation in excess of five hundred thousand  
39       dollars (\$500,000), as prescribed by G.S. 143-31.4, and an initial  
40       payment of one-sixth of the committed amount to receive a grant  
41       described in G.S. 116-41.15(b)(3);

42 and if the initial payment is accompanied by a written pledge to provide the balance  
43 within five years after the date of the initial payment. Each payment on the balance shall  
44 be no less than the amount of the initial payment. Pledged contributions may not be

1 matched prior to the actual collection of the total funds. Once the income from the  
2 institution's Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund can be effectively used  
3 pursuant to G.S. 116-41.17, the institution shall proceed to implement plans for  
4 establishing an endowed chair."

5 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 116-41.17 reads as rewritten:

6 "**§ 116-41.17. Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund; establishment of**  
7 **chairs.**

8 When the sum of the challenge grant and matching funds in the ~~Scholars'~~  
9 Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund reaches:

- 10 (1) One million dollars (\$1,000,000), if the sum of funds described in  
11 G.S. ~~116-41.15(1); or~~ 116-41.15(a)(1) or G.S. 116-41.15(b)(1); or  
12 (2) Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), if the sum of funds  
13 described in G.S. ~~116-41.15(2);~~ 116-41.15(a)(2) or  
14 G.S. 116-41.15(b)(2); or  
15 (3) An amount up to three million dollars (\$3,000,000), if the sum of  
16 funds described in G.S. 116-41.15(a)(3) or G.S. 116-41.15(b)(3);

17 the board of trustees may recommend to the Board, for its approval, the establishment of  
18 an endowed chair or chairs. The Board, in considering whether to approve the  
19 recommendation, shall include in its consideration the programs already existing in The  
20 University of North Carolina. If the Board approves the recommendation, the chair or  
21 chairs shall be established. The chair or chairs, the property of the constituent  
22 institution, may be named in honor of a donor, benefactor, or honoree of the institution,  
23 at the option of the board of trustees."

24 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
