Whereas, the John H. Race Administration Building was erected on the campus of Bennett College in 1925 to serve as a science classroom building and is now used as an administration building; and

Whereas, the John H. Race Administrative Building is an example of the Georgian Revival style of architecture, with three floors and a hipped slate roof; and

Whereas, the John H. Race Administration Building was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in April 1992; and

Whereas, the John H. Race Administration Building is in need of structural, electrical, and mechanical repairs, including handicap accessibility and safety and building code repairs; and

Whereas, a comprehensive assessment of the building's existing conditions has been completed; and

Whereas, preliminary reviews have been conducted by the North Carolina State Historic Preservation Office and the National Park Service, and the scope of work for the renovation project has been defined and construction documents have been developed; and

Whereas, the projected cost of the restoration of the John H. Race Administration Building is one million dollars (\$1,000,000), and Bennett College has received a grant from the National Park Service to fund half of the amount; and

Whereas, historic buildings of architectural significance are part of the State's cultural and historical heritage and should be preserved for the benefit of our citizens; and

Whereas, the Bennett College campus, which is open to the public, has historical significance and distinctive architectural features that may be enjoyed by all North Carolinians; and

Whereas, the appropriation of State funds to match the federal funds already granted will allow for the completion of the John H. Race Administration Building restoration project; and
