AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE A "CHOOSE LIFE" SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 20-79.4(b) is amended by adding a new subdivision to 6 read:

"(b) Types. – The Division shall issue the following types of special registration plates:

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10 (3q) 'Choose Life'. – Issuable to a registered owner of a motor vehicle in accordance with G. S. 20-81.12(b39). The plate shall bear the phrase 'Choose Life'."

SECTION 2. G.S. 20-79.7(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) Fees. – Upon request, the Division shall provide and issue free of charge one registration plate to a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor, a 100% disabled veteran, and an ex-prisoner of war. All other special registration plates, including additional Congressional Medal of Honor, 100% Disabled Veteran, and Ex-Prisoner of War plates, are subject to the regular motor vehicle registration fee in G.S. 20-87 or G.S. 20-88 plus an additional fee in the following amount:

3	SECTION 3. G.S. 20-79.7(b) reads as rewritten:	

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"(b) Distribution of Fees. – The Special Registration Plate Account and the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account are established within the Highway Fund. The Division must credit the additional fee imposed for the special registration plates listed in subsection (a) among the Special Registration Plate Account (SRPA), the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account (CCAPA), the Natural Heritage Trust Fund (NHTF), which is established under G.S. 113-77.7, and the Parks and Recreation Trust Fund, which is established under G.S. 113-44.15, as follows:

SECTION 4. G.S. 20-81.12 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: "(b39) 'Choose Life.' – The Division shall receive 300 or more applications for a 'Choose Life' plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of 'Choose Life' plates to the Crisis Pregnancy Center Fund established in

G.S. 108A-75."

SECTION 5. Article 3 of Chapter 108A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 108A-75. Crisis Pregnancy Fund.

- (a) There is established a fund to be known as the 'Crisis Pregnancy Fund' in the Department of State Treasurer, which shall be funded by a portion of the special license plate fee under G.S. 20-81.12. The money in the Fund shall be used by the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Social Services, for further distribution in accordance with this section.
- (b) The moneys in the "Crisis Pregnancy Fund" shall be distributed at the beginning of each fiscal year to nongovernmental, not for profit agencies within the county whose services include counseling and meeting the needs of pregnant women within the state who are planning to place their children for adoption. Funds shall be distributed to qualified agencies in each county in proportion to the number of registrations and renewals under this Code section from the county. No qualified organization may be discriminated against because it is religious or nonreligious. Funds shall be distributed at the beginning of the fiscal year, equally among each qualified agency with a place of business in the county which applies for funds and meets the requirements of this Code section. If a qualified agency maintains a place of business in more than one county, the agency shall be eligible to receive a pro rata share of the funds distributed in each of those counties.
- (c) If there is no qualified agency which applies to receive funds in a particular county, the portion of the Choose Life Trust Fund that would have gone to that county shall be distributed pro rata to qualified agencies that apply, which maintain a place of business within a 100 mile radius of the county seat of such county. If no qualified

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agencies apply, the funds shall be kept in an interest bearing trust fund until a qualified agency under this Code section applies for the funds.

- (d) Funds may not be distributed to any agency that is involved or associated with abortion activities, including counseling for or referrals to abortion clinics, providing medical abortion-related procedures, or pro-abortion advertising. Funds may not be distributed to any agency that charges women for services received.
- (e) Funds received shall be allocated by the qualified agency for the material needs of pregnant women who are planning to place their children for adoption or planning to parent their child, including clothing, housing, medical care, food, utilities, and transportation and for such expenses for the infants while awaiting placement with adoptive parents and the birth mother for a period of 90 days after the birth of the child. Funds may also be used to enhance the qualified agency's adoption efforts through such expenses as counseling, training, and advertising. These moneys may not be used for administrative expenses, legal expenses, or capital expenditures.
- (f) One year after an allocation to a qualified agency, any unused funds in excess of ten percent (10%) of the allocation shall be returned to the County Choose Life Trust Fund to be aggregated and redistributed with the next fiscal year distributions. No funds may be distributed to agencies or organizations described in subsection (g) of the Code section.
- (g) A qualified agency must submit to the Division of Social Services an annual audited financial statement by a certified public accountant of funds expended verifying that the funds were used in the manner described in this Code section. This shall be the only accounting requirement of the qualified agency to receive these funds. Failure to comply with any provision of this Code section will render the agency ineligible for further Choose Life funds until they shall come into full compliance and a second violation shall render them permanently ineligible for further funds.
- (h) In order to become a qualified agency to apply for and receive the funds available through the "Crisis Pregnancy Fund", an agency must deliver to the Division of Social Services an application certifying items in paragraphs (i) through (9) of this subsection. Such application must contain an affidavit signed by a duly authorized officer of the agency certifying under penalty of perjury that the information given in the application is true and correct to the best of his or her knowledge and belief:
 - (1) The agency is a not for profit corporation;
 - (2) The agency does not discriminate because of race, marital status, gender, religion, national origin, handicap, or age;
 - (3) The agency is committed to counseling and meeting the physical needs of pregnant women who are committed to either raising their own children or placing their children for adoption;
 - (4) The agency is not involved or associated with any abortion activities, including counseling for or referrals to abortion clinics, providing medical abortion-related procedures, or pro-abortion advertising;
 - (5) The agency does not charge women for services received;
 - (6) The agency agrees and understands that the funds can only be spent on the material needs of pregnant women who are planning to place their

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
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- those in Section 5, subsection (g).
- There shall be no additional requirements placed upon a qualified agency, such as record keeping, record disclosure or additional insurance because they received the Choose Life funds, except as necessary to meet the requirements of this Code section.

SECTION 6. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
