42	<u>(5)</u>	The agency does not charge women for services received;
43	<u>(6)</u>	The agency agrees and understands that the funds can only be spent on
44		the material needs of pregnant women who are planning to place their

2		clothing, housing, medical care, food, utilities, and transportation and
3		for such expenses for the infants while awaiting placement with
4		adoptive parents and the birth mother for a period of 90 days after the

9		The agency understands and agrees that funds not used within one year
10		of allocation, that exceed ten percent (10%) of the allocation, must be
