A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO MAKE IT A CRIMINAL OFFENSE TO CONCEAL THE DEATH OF A
PERSON.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 52 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by
adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-401.22. Concealment of death.

(a) Any person who, with the intent to conceal the death of a person, fails to
notify a law enforcement authority of the death or secretly buries or otherwise secretly
disposes of a dead human body is guilty of a Class I felony.

(b) Any person who aids, counsels, or abets any other person in concealing the
death of a person is guilty of a Class A1 misdemeanor."

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2005, and applies to
offenses committed on or after that date.
