"§ 20-403. Exemptions.

(c) Any misdemeanor.

Nothing in this Article shall be construed to prohibit or affect:

Practice by persons employed by any federal, State, or municipal (1) 1 2 agency. 3 **(2)** Practice by a person who is a student in an educational or certification program approved by the Board. 4 5 A person performing automotive glass work, automotive glass repair (3) 6 work, or flat glass work in this State so long as the services are not 7 performed more than four times per year. 8 Employees of industrial firms whose main duties concern the **(4)** 9 maintenance of automotive work or flat glass work on its own or 10 leased premises for its own use. The fabrication of glass products. 11 (5) 12 Persons engaged in the installation, maintenance, repair, or service of (6) glass for single-family residences owned and occupied or to be 13 14 occupied by those persons, subject to inspection and approval by the 15 building official and in conformance with State building codes. A person who installs, maintains, or repairs glass in a motor vehicle 16 (7) 17 owned or leased by that person. "§ 20-404. Definitions. 26 27 The following definitions apply in this Article: Accredited businesses. - Glass shops that have met all the 28 (1) 29 requirements of the National Glass Association Business Accreditation 30 Council and received the accredited business designation. Automotive glass work. - The act of installing, maintaining, or 31 (2) 32 repairing fixed glass in motor vehicles. Board. - The North Carolina Glass Technicians Board of Examiners. 33 (3) Flat glass work. – The act of installing, maintaining, or repairing glass 34 (4) 35 in residential or commercial structures. Licensed automotive glass repair technician. – A person licensed under 36 (5) this Article to provide repairs to damaged fixed glass in motor 37 38 vehicles. 39 Licensed automotive glass technician. – A person licensed under this (6) Article to provide automotive glass work. 40 Licensed flat glass technician. – A person licensed under this Article to 41 (7) 42 provide flat glass work. "§ 20-405. North Carolina Glass Technicians Board of Examiners. 43

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- (a) <u>Composition and Terms. The North Carolina Glass Technicians Board of Examiners is created. The Board shall consist of seven members who shall serve staggered terms. The initial Board members shall be appointed on or before January 1, 2006, as follows:</u>
 - (1) The General Assembly, upon the recommendation of the President Pro
 Tempore of the Senate, shall appoint three members. One of these
 members shall be a certified automotive glass technician who shall
 serve a three-year term, one shall be a certified automotive repair
 technician who shall serve a two-year term, and one shall be a certified
 flat glass technician who shall serve a one-year term.
 - (2) The General Assembly, upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, shall appoint three members. One of these members shall be a certified automotive glass technician who shall serve a three-year term, one shall be a certified automotive repair technician who shall serve a two-year term, and one shall be a certified flat glass technician who shall serve a one-year term.
 - (3) The Governor shall appoint one public member who is a consumer of glass work or has an interest in the rights of consumers who shall serve a three-year term.

Initial Board members appointed on or before January 1, 2006, do not have to be licensed upon appointment. However, once licensure requirements are established, those initial Board members shall satisfy the applicable requirements for licensure pursuant to this Article.

Upon the expiration of the terms of the initial Board members, each member shall be appointed for a term of three years and shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualified. No member may serve more than two consecutive terms.

- (b) Qualifications. All members of the Board shall reside in this State and shall represent the various geographical areas or congressional districts of the State.
- (c) Vacancies. A vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment, except that all unexpired terms in seats appointed by the General Assembly shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Appointees to fill vacancies shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term and until their successors have been duly appointed and qualified.
- (d) Removal. The Board may remove any of its members for neglect of duty, incompetence, or unprofessional conduct. A member subject to disciplinary proceedings as a licensee shall be disqualified from participating in the official business of the Board until the charges have been resolved.
- (e) <u>Compensation. Each member of the Board shall receive per diem and</u> reimbursement for travel and subsistence as provided in G.S. 93B-5.
- (f) Officers. The officers of the Board shall be a chair, a vice-chair, and other officers deemed necessary by the Board to carry out the purposes of this Article. All officers shall be elected annually during the first meeting of the calendar year by the Board for one-year terms and shall serve until their successors are elected and qualified.

Meetings. – The Board shall hold at least two meetings each year to conduct 1 2 business and to review the standards and rules for issuing licenses under this Article. 3 The Board shall adopt rules governing the calling, holding, and conducting of regular 4 and special meetings. A majority of Board members shall constitute a quorum. 5 "§ 20-406. Powers and duties. 6 The Board shall have the following powers and duties: 7 Administer and enforce the provisions of this Article. (1) 8 (2) Adopt rules as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this 9 Article. 10 (3) Examine and determine the qualifications and fitness of applicants for licensure and renewal of licensure. 11 12 (4) Issue, renew, deny, suspend, or revoke licenses and conduct any disciplinary actions authorized by this Article. 13 14 (5) Set fees as provided in G.S. 20-409. Establish and approve continuing education requirements for persons 15 (6) licensed under this Article. 16 17 Receive and investigate complaints from members of the public. (7) 18 (8) Conduct investigations for the purpose of determining whether violations of this Article or grounds for disciplining licensees exist. 19 Conduct administrative hearings in accordance with Article 3A of 20 <u>(9)</u> 21 Chapter 150B of the General Statutes. Maintain a record of all proceedings conducted by the Board and make 22 (10)available to licensees and other concerned parties an annual report of 23 24 all Board action. Maintain a list of the names and addresses of all persons licensed by 25 (11)26 the Board. 27 Employ and fix the compensation of personnel that the Board (12)determines is necessary to carry out the provisions of this Article and 28 29 incur other expenses necessary to perform the duties of the Board. 30 Adopt a seal containing the name of the Board for use on all licenses (13)and official reports issued by the Board. 31 32 Prescribe standards of ethical conduct for automotive glass work, (14)33 automotive glass repair work, and flat glass work. "§ 20-407. Oualifications for licensure: examination. 34 35 An applicant shall be licensed as an automotive glass technician if the applicant meets all of the following qualifications: 36 Has obtained a high school diploma or equivalent. 37 (1) 38 (2) Is at least 18 years of age. 39 Is of good moral and ethical character. (3) Has successfully completed the application process. 40 (4) Possesses current credentials as a 'Certified Automotive Glass 41 (5) 42 Technician' issued by the National Glass Association (NGA) or is certified as an automotive glass technician by a nationally recognized 43 44 certification committee recognized by the Board.

Provides evidence that he or she has met all proper safety training and 1 (6) 2 certification for automotive glass work. 3 Has at least six months of work experience as an automotive glass <u>(7)</u> technician before applying for licensure under this Article. 4 5 Has successfully passed a national examination administered or **(8)** 6 approved by the Board. 7 Pays the required fee under G.S. 20-409. (9) An applicant shall be licensed as an automotive glass repair technician if the 8 (b) 9 applicant meets all of the following qualifications: 10 (1) Has obtained a high school diploma or equivalent. (2) Is at least 18 years of age. 11 12 (3) Is of good moral and ethical character. Has successfully completed the application process. 13 (4) 14 (5) Has completed a certified automotive glass technician course through 15 the NGA, a Board-approved community college program, or other Board-approved certification program. 16 17 (6) Provides evidence that he or she has met all proper safety training and 18 certification for automotive glass repair work. Has at least one year of work experience as an automotive glass repair 19 <u>(7)</u> 20 technician before applying for licensure under this Article. 21 (8) Has successfully passed a national examination administered or approved by the Board. 22 (9) Pays the required fee under G.S. 20-409. 23 24 An applicant shall be licensed as a flat glass technician if the applicant meets (c) 25 all of the following qualifications: (1) Has obtained a high school diploma or equivalent. 26 27 (2) Is at least 18 years of age. Is of good moral and ethical character. 28 (3) Has successfully completed the application process. 29 (4) 30 (5) Has completed a certified automotive glass technician course through the NGA, a Board-approved community college program, or other 31 Board-approved certification program. 32 Provides evidence that he or she has met all proper safety training and 33 (6) certification for flat glass work. 34 35 Has at least one year of work experience as a flat glass technician <u>(7)</u> before applying for licensure under this Article. 36 Has successfully passed a national examination administered or 37 (8) 38 approved by the Board. Pays the required fee under G.S. 20-409. 39 (9) At least twice a year, the Board shall cause the examination required in this 40 (d) section to be given to the applicants at a time and place to be determined by the Board. 41 42 Any applicant who fails to pass the first examination may retake the examination in accordance with rules adopted by the Board. 43

"§ 20-408. Reciprocity.

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Upon filing an application and payment of the required fee, the Board may issue a license without examination to an applicant who is licensed as an automotive glass technician, automotive glass repair technician, or flat glass technician in another state or territory if the requirements for licensure in that state or territory are substantially equal to the requirements for licensure in this State as determined by the Board.

"§ 20-409. Fees.

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The Board shall establish fees not to exceed the following amounts:

(1) <u>Issuance of a license</u>	<u>\$200.00</u>
<u>(</u>	2) Renewal of a license	\$200.00
<u>(</u>	3) Examination	\$250.00
<u>(</u>	4) Reinstatement	\$150.00
(5) Late fees	\$150.00.

"§ 20-410. License renewal; display of license; license nontransferable.

- (a) All licenses shall expire one year after the date they were issued unless renewed. At least 30 days before the expiration date of a license, the Board shall send the licensee an application and notice of renewal of license. All applications for renewal shall be filed with the Board and shall be accompanied by the renewal fee as required by G.S. 20-409. A license that has expired for failure to renew may be reinstated after the applicant pays the late and reinstatement fees as required by G.S. 20-409. The Board may establish any other license renewal requirements as necessary pursuant to rules adopted by the Board.
- (b) The Board shall replace any license that is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, subject to rules established by the Board.
- (c) Every automotive glass technician, automotive glass repair technician, and flat glass technician issued a license under this Article shall display the license prominently in his or her place of business and the technician's license number shall appear on all proposals, contracts, or requests for permits issued by municipalities.
 - (d) A license may not be transferred or assigned.

"§ 20-411. Grounds for disciplinary action.

The Board may deny, revoke, suspend, refuse to renew, censure, or reprimand a licensee or an applicant or place a licensee on probation for any of the following:

- (1) Practicing automotive glass work, automotive glass repair work, or flat glass work in violation of the provisions of this Article or any rules adopted by the Board.
- (2) Obtaining or attempting to obtain a license by fraud or misrepresentation.
- (3) Having been convicted of a felony in the courts of this State or any other state.
- (4) Gross negligence in automotive glass work, automotive glass repair work, or flat glass work that results in injury to another.
- (5) Engaging in dishonorable, unethical, or unprofessional conduct of a character likely to deceive, defraud, or harm the public.
- (6) Habitual intoxication or addition to the use of drugs.

- 1 (7) <u>Directly or indirectly giving or receiving a fee, commission, rebate, or other form of compensation for a service not actually rendered.</u>
 - (8) Failure to respond to a written request for information by the Board within 60 days.
 - (9) <u>Having had a license or certification revoked or suspended or other</u> disciplinary action taken by authorities of another state or territory.
 - (10) Aiding or abetting a person not licensed in this State who directly or indirectly performs automotive glass work, automotive glass repair work, or flat glass work requiring a license.
 - (11) Has made material misstatements in the application for licensure or renewal.
 - (12) Has demonstrated gross negligence, incompetency, or misconduct in the performance of automotive glass work, automotive glass repair work, or flat glass work.

"§ 20-412. Injunctive relief.

The Board may apply to the superior court for an order enjoining violations of this Article. Upon a showing by the Board that any person has violated this Article, the court may grant injunctive relief."

SECTION 2. Any person who submits proof to the Board that the person has practiced automotive glass work, automotive glass repair work, or flat glass work full time for at least five consecutive years prior to the effective date of this act, has completed a nationally recognized certification program in automotive glass work, automotive glass repair work, or flat glass work approved by the Board, or is certified as an automotive glass technician, automotive glass repair technician, or flat glass technician by the National Glass Association or an equivalent, nationally recognized successor organization recognized by the Board may be granted the appropriate license upon completion of an investigation of the applicant's work history by the Board and payment of the required fee under G.S. 20-409, enacted in Section 1 of this act, without having to satisfy the requirements of G.S. 20-407, enacted in Section 1 of this act. All persons who do not make application to the Board within one year of the effective date of this act shall be required to complete all requirements prescribed by the Board and to otherwise comply with the provisions of Article 18 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes, enacted by Section 1 of this act.

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
