Short Title: Water Resources Management/Funds. (Public)

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
3 ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES FOR REGIONAL COUNCILS
4 OF GOVERNMENT TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A WATER RESOURCE
5 MANAGEMENT PROGRAM.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
8 Department of Environment and Natural Resources the sum of one million two hundred
9 seventy-five thousand dollars (\$1,275,000) for fiscal year 2005-2006 and the sum of one
10 million two hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$1,275,000) for fiscal year
11 2006-2007. Of these funds, the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) shall be
12 allocated to each of the State's 17 regional councils of government. These funds shall
13 be used by each regional council of government to develop and implement a
14 nonregulatory water resource management program through the voluntary cooperation
15 of local governments, water users, other stakeholders, and the Department of
16 Environment and Natural Resources.

17 **SECTION 2.** In developing and implementing the water resource
18 management program, each regional council of government shall carry out a plan of
19 work that may include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 20 (1) Development of one or more multijurisdictional water resource
21 management plans in cooperation with local governments and key
22 water user stakeholders, and the Department of Environment and
23 Natural Resources, based on the water resource needs, geographic and
24 hydrologic features in the region, including both surface and
25 groundwater resources as appropriate to the region.
- 26 (2) Convening coalitions of local governments and major water users in
27 the respective regions to set strategies for sustaining water resources
28 necessary to support sound economic development.

1 (3) Implementation of multijurisdictional projects and activities that
2 address water quantity and water quality problems identified in water
3 resource management plans.

4 (4) Identification of opportunities for connections between water systems
5 and wastewater system providers to achieve efficiencies and make
6 systems more drought resistant.

7 **SECTION 3.(a)** Funds appropriated by this act shall be paid by electronic
8 transfer in two equal installments. The first payment shall be made only after
9 compliance with subdivision (b)(1) of this section, and the second payment shall be
10 made only after compliance with subdivision (b)(2) of this section.

11 **SECTION 3.(b)** Each regional council of government receiving funds under
12 this act shall comply with the following requirements:

13 (1) By September 1, 2005, the council shall present to the Department of
14 Environment and Natural Resources and the Fiscal Research Division,
15 the council's annual plan of work, goals, objectives, and proposed
16 expenditures.

17 (2) By February 15, 2006, the council shall submit to the Department of
18 Environment and Natural Resources and the Fiscal Research Division,
19 a report of the council's accomplishments and of the actual
20 expenditures of funds appropriated by this act during the previous
21 reporting period.

22 **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
