3 4	Comprehensive Major Medical Plan. <b>SECTION 1.(c)</b> Duties. – The Commission shall study the feasibility of

5 6	establishing an Office for Prescription Drug Cost Management ("Office") in the Department of Administration or other appropriate State agency to manage the cost of		
7	prescription drugs incurred by State agencies and programs that cover or provide		
8	prescription drugs. The responsibilities of the Office shall include negotiating		
9	prescription drug price discounts with participating pharmaceutical manufacturers and		
10	pharmacists for prescription drugs paid for, in whole or in part, with State funds. As		
10	used in this section, "State agency" includes the Teachers' and State Employees'		
12	Comprehensive Major Medical Plan. In conducting the study, the Commission shall		
12	consider the following:		
13	(1) The estimated amount that each State agency pays annually for		
15	prescription drugs, including any discounts or rebates currently in		
16	effect.		
17	(2) Current contractual obligations of State agencies to pay for		
18	prescription drug coverage or purchase.		
19	(3) Incentives for prescription drug manufacturers and pharmacists to		
20	participate in the State prescription drug cost management program.		
21	(4) Formularies or other methods of containing prescription drug costs		
22	currently in effect for State agencies and programs.		
23	(5) Necessity for and feasibility of interfacing the implementation of the		
24	prescription drug cost management program with information		
25	management systems currently used by State agencies.		
26	(6) Experiences of other states in attempting to control prescription drug		
27	costs through multistate compacts, bulk purchasing, or negotiated

33	SECTION 1.(d) Reports. – The Commission shall submit a final written		
34	report of its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly not later than the		
35	convening of the 2007 General Assembly. The Commission may submit a progress		
36	report to the 2006 Regular Session of the 2005 General Assembly. The reports may		
37	include legislative proposals necessary to implement the Commission's		
38	recommendations and an analysis of the fiscal impact of each recommendation. The		
39	Commission shall terminate upon the earlier of the filing of its final report or upon the		
40	convening of the 2007 General Assembly.		
41	<b>SECTION 1.(e)</b> Expenses of members. – Members of the Commission shall		
42	be paid per diem, subsistence, and travel expenses, as follows:		
43	(1) Commission members who are members of the General Assembly		

shall be paid in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1.

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(2)Commission members who are officials or employees of the State or 1 2 local government agencies shall be paid in accordance with 3 G.S. 138-6. 4 (3) All other Commission members shall be paid in accordance with 5 G.S. 138-5. SECTION 1.(f) Cochairs; meetings. - The President Pro Tempore of the 6 7 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each appoint a cochair for 8 the Commission from their respective appointees. The Commission shall meet upon the 9 call of the cochairs. A majority of the Commission members shall constitute a quorum. 10 The Commission may meet during a regular or special session of the General Assembly, subject to the approval of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of 11 12 the House of Representatives. The Legislative Services Commission may provide 13 meeting space to the Commission in the State Legislative Building or in the Legislative 14 Office Building. 15 **SECTION 1.(g)** Staff. – With the prior approval of the Legislative Services 16 Commission, the Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional staff to assist in 17 the work of the Commission. 18 **SECTION 1.(h)** Cooperation by government agencies. – The Commission 19 may call upon any department, agency, institution, or officer of the State or any political 20 subdivision of the State for facilities, data, or other assistance. All State departments and 21 agencies, local governments, and their subdivisions shall cooperate with the 22 Commission and, upon request, shall furnish the Commission and its staff any 23 information in their possession or available to them. 24 **SECTION 2.** From funds appropriated to the General Assembly, the 25 Legislative Services Commission shall allocate funds for the expenses of the Commission established by this act. 26 27 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
