2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT JURORS MAY NOT PROFIT FROM THEIR JURY
3	SERVICE AND SHALL BE SUBJECT TO FORFEITURE OF SUCH PROFITS.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Article 1 of Chapter 9 of the General Statutes is amended by
6	adding a new section to read:
7	"§ 9-7.1. No profits based upon jury service; forfeiture.
8	(a) Pursuant to the public policy set forth by G.S. 9-6(a) establishing jury service
9	as a solemn public duty of all qualified citizens, no person performing jury service may
10	profit from that service and shall be subject to forfeiture of any such profit. For purposes
11	of this section, "profit" from jury service means any income, assets, or other property
12	obtained through or generated as a direct result of jury service, whether generated as
13	compensation for written or oral accounts provided by the juror about the jury
14	deliberations or by any other means. "Profit" does not include the fees and expenses
15	provided to a juror pursuant to G.S. 7A-312 or any other authorized compensation for
16	jury service.
17	(b) Whenever an officer of the court or other person believes that a juror has
18	profited from jury service in violation of subsection (a) of this section, that person shall
19	notify the Attorney General, who may initiate forfeiture proceedings under this section
20	upon a determination that there are reasonable grounds to believe that the person has
21	profited from jury service in violation of this section. Such an action shall be an in rem
22	proceeding against the income, assets, or other property and shall be governed by
23	Chapter 1A of the General Statutes. The clear proceeds of any forfeitures ordered by the
24	court under this section shall be deposited in the Civil Penalty and Forfeiture Fund
25	established in G.S. 115C-457.1."
26	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to acts
27	committed on or after that date.
