G.S. 66-58 is amended by adding the following new 24 subsections: 25 "(i) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, nothing in this section shall prohibit The University of North Carolina from engaging in an activity that does any of 26 27 the following: 28 (1) Furthers the mission of the University as stated in G.S. 116-1. 29 Primarily serves students, employees, or alumni of the University. (2) Enables the community in which a constituent institution or other 30 (3) University entity is located, or the people of the State, to utilize the 31 32 University's facilities, equipment, or expertise, and the activity is not unfair competition. Whether an activity is unfair competition shall be 33 determined as set out in subsection (i) of this section. 34 35 36

(j) The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall establish a panel to determine whether an activity undertaken pursuant to subdivision (i)(3) of this section is unfair competition with an existing or proposed nongovernmental entity. The panel shall consist of an equal number of members appointed by the Governor who are familiar with the interests of the business community of the State and members appointed by the Board of Governors none of whom may be employees of The University of North Carolina. The panel may make the determination whether a proposed or ongoing activity of The University of North Carolina is unfair competition based on a complaint from any nongovernmental entity in the State that is in or proposes to be in the same or a similar or competing business or based on a request

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- from the constituent institution or other university system entity engaging in or proposing to engage in the activity. The University of North Carolina and its employees may rely on a determination by the panel as to whether an activity violates this section, and a determination that an activity is not unfair competition and therefore does not violate this section shall be an absolute defense in any prosecution brought under this section.
 - (k) The proceeds of any activity undertaken under subsection (i) or subsection (j) of this section shall be placed in an institutional trust fund pursuant to G.S. 116-36.1 and shall be used to continue to conduct the activity that generated the proceeds or to further the mission of the constituent institution or other University entity engaging in the activity."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
