1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE SHINING OF LIGHTS IN DEER AREAS IN
3	JACKSON COUNTY.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. It is unlawful to shine a light intentionally upon a deer or to
6	sweep a light in search of deer between the hours of one-half hour after sunset and
7	one-half hour before sunrise.
8	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this act shall not be construed to prevent:
9	(1) The lawful hunting of raccoon or opossum during open season with
10	artificial lights designed or commonly used in taking raccoon and
11	opossum at night;
12	(2) The necessary shining of lights by landholders on their own lands;
13	(3) The shining of lights necessary to normal travel by motor vehicles on
14 15	roads or highways; or (4) The use of lights by compare and others who are legitimately in these
15 16	(4) The use of lights by campers and others who are legitimately in these
10	areas for other reasons and who are not attempting to attract or to immobilize deer by the use of lights.
17	SECTION 3. Violation of this act is a Class 3 misdemeanor. A second or
10 19	subsequent conviction occurring within one year of a prior conviction is a Class 2
20	misdemeanor.
20	SECTION 4. This act is enforceable by law enforcement officers of the
22	Wildlife Resources Commission, by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and by other peace
23	officers with general subject matter jurisdiction.
24	SECTION 5. This act applies only to Jackson County.
25	SECTION 6. This act becomes effective October 1, 2008.
