A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE NORTH CAROLINA SCHOOL OF THE ARTS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA SCHOOL OF THE ARTS AND TO APPROPRIATE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE SCHOOL OF THE ARTS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 116-2(4) reads as rewritten:

"(4) 'Constituent institution' or 'institution' means one of the 16 public institutions of higher education, to wit, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, North Carolina State University at Raleigh, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, the University of North Carolina at Asheville, the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Appalachian State University, East Carolina University, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University, North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, North Carolina Central University, North Carolina School of the Arts, redesignated effective July 1, 2008, as the 'University of North Carolina School of the Arts,' Pembroke State University, redesignated effective July 1, 1996, as the "University of North Carolina at Pembroke", Western Carolina University, and Winston-Salem State University, and the constituent high school, the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics."

SECTION 2. G.S. 116-4 reads as rewritten:

"§ 116-4. Constituent institutions of the University of North Carolina.

The University of North Carolina shall be composed of the following institutions of higher education: the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, North Carolina State University at Raleigh, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, the University of

1 North Carolina at Charlotte, the University of North Carolina at Asheville, the
2 University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Appalachian State University, East
3 Carolina University, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University,
4 North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, North Carolina Central
5 University, North Carolina School of the Arts, redesignated effective July 1, 2008, as
6 the 'University of North Carolina School of the Arts,' Pembroke State University,
7 redesignated effective July 1, 1996, as the "University of North Carolina at Pembroke",
8 Western Carolina University and Winston-Salem State University, and the constituent
9 high school, the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics."

10 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 116-5(a)(2) reads as rewritten:

11 "(2) One person elected prior to January 1, 1972, by and from the
12 membership of the board of trustees of each of the following
13 institutions: Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State
14 University, North Carolina School of the Arts, redesignated effective
15 July 1, 2008, as the 'University of North Carolina School of the Arts,'
16 Pembroke State University, redesignated effective July 1, 1996, as the
17 "University of North Carolina at Pembroke", and Winston-Salem State
18 University."

19 **SECTION 4.** G.S. 116-12 reads as rewritten:

20 **"§ 116-12. Property and obligations.**

21 All property of whatsoever kind and all rights and privileges held by the Board of
22 Higher Education and by the Boards of Trustees of Appalachian State University, East
23 Carolina University, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University,
24 North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, North Carolina Central
25 University, North Carolina School of the Arts, redesignated effective July 1, 2008, as
26 the 'University of North Carolina School of the Arts,' Pembroke State University,
27 redesignated effective July 1, 1996, as the "University of North Carolina at Pembroke",
28 Western Carolina University and Winston-Salem State University, as said property,
29 rights and privileges may exist immediately prior to July 1, 1972, shall be, and hereby
30 are, effective July 1, 1972, transferred to and vested in the Board of Governors of the
31 University of North Carolina. All obligations of whatsoever kind of the Board of Higher
32 Education and of the Boards of Trustees of Appalachian State University, East Carolina
33 University, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University, North
34 Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, North Carolina Central
35 University, North Carolina School of the Arts, redesignated effective July 1, 2008, as
36 the 'University of North Carolina School of the Arts,' Pembroke State University,
37 redesignated effective July 1, 1996, as the "University of North Carolina at Pembroke",
38 Western Carolina University and Winston-Salem State University, as said obligations
39 may exist immediately prior to July 1, 1972, shall be, and the same hereby are, effective
40 July 1, 1972, transferred to and assumed by the Board of Governors of the University of
41 North Carolina. Any property, real or personal, held immediately prior to July 1, 1972,
42 by a board of trustees of a constituent institution for the benefit of that institution or by
43 the University of North Carolina for the benefit of any one or more of its six
44 institutions, shall from and after July 1, 1972, be kept separate and distinct from other

1 property held by the Board of Governors, shall continue to be held for the benefit of the
2 institution or institutions that were previously the beneficiaries and shall continue to be
3 held subject to the provisions of the respective instruments, grants or other means or
4 process by which any property right was acquired. All property of whatsoever kind and
5 all rights and privileges held by the Board of Trustees of the North Carolina School of
6 Science and Mathematics, as said property, rights and privileges may exist immediately
7 prior to July 1, 2007, shall be and hereby are, effective July 1, 2007, transferred to and
8 vested in the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina. All obligations
9 of whatsoever kind of the Board of Trustees of the North Carolina School of Science
10 and Mathematics as said obligations may exist immediately prior to July 1, 2007, shall
11 be, and the same hereby are, effective July 1, 2007, transferred to and assumed by the
12 Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina. In case a conflict arises as to
13 which property, rights or privileges were held for the beneficial interest of a particular
14 institution, or as to the extent to which such property, rights or privileges were so held,
15 the Board of Governors shall determine the issue, and the determination of the Board
16 shall constitute final administrative action. Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to
17 increase or diminish the income, other revenue or specific property which is pledged, or
18 otherwise hypothecated, for the security or liquidation of any obligations, it being the
19 intent that the Board of Governors shall assume said obligations without thereby either
20 enlarging or diminishing the rights of the holders thereof."

21 **SECTION 5.** G.S. 116-31(a) reads as rewritten:

22 "(a) All persons who, as of June 30, 1972, are serving as trustees of the regional
23 universities and of the North Carolina School of the Arts, redesignated effective July 1,
24 2008, as the 'University of North Carolina School of the Arts,' except those who may
25 have been elected to the Board of Governors, shall continue to serve for one year
26 beginning July 1, 1972, and the terms of all such trustees shall continue for the period of
27 one year."

28 **SECTION 6.** G.S. 116-41.13A reads as rewritten:

29 **"§ 116-41.13A. Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund; definitions.**

30 The following definitions apply in this Part:

- 31 (1) "Focused growth institution" means Elizabeth City State University,
32 Fayetteville State University, North Carolina Agricultural and
33 Technical University, North Carolina Central University, The
34 University of North Carolina at Pembroke, Western Carolina
35 University, and Winston-Salem State University.
- 36 (2) "Special needs institution" means the North Carolina School of the
37 Arts–Arts, redesignated effective July 1, 2008, as the 'University of
38 North Carolina School of the Arts' and The University of North
39 Carolina at Asheville."

40 **SECTION 7.** G.S. 116-64 reads as rewritten:

41 **"§ 116-64. Establishment of school.**

42 There is hereby established, and there shall be maintained, a school for the
43 professional training of students having exceptional talent in the performing arts which
44 shall be defined as an educational institution of the State, to serve the students of North

1 Carolina and other states, particularly other states of the South. The school shall be
2 designated the "North Carolina School of the ~~Arts~~Arts, redesignated effective July 1,
3 2008, as the 'University of North Carolina School of the Arts.'"

4 **SECTION 8.** G.S. 116-65 reads as rewritten:

5 **"§ 116-65. To be part of University of North Carolina; membership of Board of**
6 **Trustees.**

7 The North Carolina School of ~~Arts~~ Arts, redesignated effective July 1, 2008, as the
8 'University of North Carolina School of the Arts,' is a part of the University of North
9 Carolina and subject to the provisions of Article 1, Chapter 116, of the General Statutes;
10 provided, however, that notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 116-31, the Board of
11 Trustees of said school shall consist of 15 persons, 13 of whom are selected in
12 accordance with provisions of G.S. 116-31, and the conductor of the North Carolina
13 Symphony, or the conductor's designee, and the Secretary of the Department of Cultural
14 Resources, both serving ex officio and nonvoting."

15 **SECTION 9.** G.S. 116-209.19 reads as rewritten:

16 **"§ 116-209.19. Grants to students.**

17 The Authority is authorized to make grants to eligible students enrolled or to be
18 enrolled in eligible institutions in North Carolina out of such money as from time to
19 time may be appropriated by the State or as may otherwise be available to the Authority
20 for such grants. The Authority, subject to the provisions of this Article and any
21 applicable appropriation act, shall adopt rules, regulations and procedures for
22 determining the needs of the respective students for grants and for the purpose of
23 making such grants. The amount of any grant made by the Authority to any student,
24 whether enrolled or to be enrolled in any private institution or any tax-supported public
25 institution, shall be determined by the Authority upon the basis of substantially similar
26 standards and guides that shall be set forth in the Authority's rules, regulations and
27 procedures; provided, however, that grants made in any fiscal year to students enrolled
28 or to be enrolled in private institutions may be increased to compensate, in whole or in
29 part, for the average annual State appropriated tuition subsidy for such fiscal year,
30 determined as provided herein. The average annual State appropriated subsidy for each
31 fiscal year shall be determined by the Secretary of Administration, after consultation
32 with the Board of Governors of the University of North Carolina and the Authority, for
33 each of the two categories of tax-supported institutions, being (i) institutions, presently
34 16, that provide education of the collegiate grade and grant baccalaureate degrees and
35 (ii) institutions, such as community colleges and technical institutes created and existing
36 under Chapter 115A of the General Statutes and community colleges created and
37 existing under Chapter 115D of the General Statutes. The average annual State
38 appropriated subsidy for each of such two categories of institutions shall mean the
39 amount of the total appropriations of the State for the respective fiscal years under the
40 current operations budgets, pursuant to the State Budget Act reasonably allocable to
41 undergraduate students enrolled in such institutions exclusive of the Division of Health
42 Affairs of the University of North Carolina and the North Carolina School of the ~~Arts~~
43 Arts, redesignated effective July 1, 2008, as the 'University of North Carolina School of
44 the Arts' for all institutions in such category, all as shall be determined by the Secretary

1 of Administration after consultation as above provided, divided by the budgeted number
2 of North Carolina undergraduate students to be enrolled in such fiscal year.

3 The Authority, in determining the needs of students for grants, may among other
4 factors, give consideration to the amount of other financial assistance that may be
5 available to the students, such as nonrepayable awards under the Pell Grant Program,
6 the Health Professions Education Assistance Act or other student assistance programs
7 created by federal law."

8 SECTION 10. G.S. 147-54 reads as rewritten:

9 "§ 147-54. Printing, distribution and sale of the North Carolina Manual.

10 The Secretary of State shall have printed biennially for distribution and sale, two
11 thousand three hundred fifty (2,350) copies of the North Carolina Manual, and shall
12 make distribution to the State agencies, individuals, institutions and others as herein set
13 forth.

31	After making the above distribution, the remainder shall be sold at the cost of	
32	publication plus tax and postage and the proceeds from such sales deposited with the	
33	State Treasurer for use by the Publications Division of the Secretary of State's Office to	
34	defray the expense of publishing the North Carolina Manual. Libraries and educational	
35	institutions not covered in the above distribution shall be entitled to a twenty percent	
36	(20%) discount on the cost of any purchase(s)."	
37	SECTION 11. G.S. 165-20(6) reads as rewritten:	
38	"(6) "State educational institution" means any educational institution of	
39	higher learning which is owned and operated by the State of North	
40	Carolina, or any community college operated under the provisions of	
41	Chapter 115A and Article 3 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes of	
42	North Carolina, or the college program of the North Carolina School	
43	of the Arts, <u>redesignated effective July 1, 2008, as the 'University of</u>	
44	<u>North Carolina School of the Arts,'</u> or any technical institute operated	

1 under the provisions of Chapter 115A of the General Statutes of North
2 Carolina."

3 **SECTION 12.** The General Statutes are further amended by substituting the
4 phrase "University of North Carolina School of the Arts" for the phrase "North Carolina
5 School of the Arts" wherever that phrase may appear.

6 **SECTION 13.(a)** All statutory and other legal authority, powers, duties,
7 functions, records, personnel, property, and unexpended balances of appropriations or
8 other funds of the North Carolina School of the Arts remain those of the University of
9 North Carolina School of the Arts.

10 **SECTION 13.(b)** Nothing in this act requires the immediate replacement of
11 any stationery, other supplies, or any emblems or other symbols used by the University
12 of North Carolina School of the Art, as they existed prior to the enactment of this act.

13 **SECTION 14.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of
14 Governors of the University of North Carolina the sum of one million dollars
15 (\$1,000,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to provide special focus institution funding
16 for the North Carolina School of the Arts. These funds are needed because the mission
17 and limited size of this institution make it difficult for it to generate sufficient funds
18 from the student credit hour enrollment funding model and other sources to provide the
19 services students need.

20 **SECTION 15.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
