The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
SECTION 1. G.S. 153A-340 is amended by adding a new subsection to			
read:			
"(i) In order to encourage construction that uses sustainable design principles and			
to improve energy efficiency in buildings, a county may charge reduced building permit			
fees or provide partial rebates of building permit fees for buildings that are constructed			
or renovated using design principles that conform to or exceed one or more of the			
following certifications or ratings:			
(1) <u>Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification</u>			
or higher rating under certification standards adopted by the U.S			
Green Building Council and referred to as LEED-NB standard for new			
buildings or the LEED-EB building standard for existing buildings.			
(2) A One Globe or higher rating under the Green Globes program			
standards adopted by the Green Building Initiative.			
(3) A certification or rating by another nationally recognized certification			
or rating system that is equivalent or greater than those listed in			
subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection."			
SECTION 2. G.S. 160A-381 is amended by adding a new subsection to			
read:			
"(i) In order to encourage construction that uses sustainable design principles and			
to improve energy efficiency in buildings, a city may charge reduced building permit			

fees or provide partial rebates of building permit fees for buildings that are constructed
