2	AN ACT TO APPLY STATEWIDE BOARDS OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
3	AUTHORITY OVER COMMISSIONS, BOARDS, AND AGENCIES.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 153A-77 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 153A-77. Authority of boards of commissioners in certain counties over
7	commissions, boards, agencies, etc.
8	(a) In the exercise of its jurisdiction over commissions, boards and agencies, the
9	board of county commissioners may assume direct control of any activities theretofore
10	conducted by or through any commission, board or agency by the adoption of a
11	resolution assuming and conferring upon the board of county commissioners all powers,
12	responsibilities and duties of any such commission, board or agency. This subsection
13	shall apply to the board of health, the social services board, area mental health,
14	developmental disabilities, and substance abuse area board and any other commission,
15	board or agency appointed by the board of county commissioners or acting under and
16	pursuant to authority of the board of county commissioners of said county. A board of
17	county commissioners exercising the power and authority under this subsection may,
18	notwithstanding G.S. 130A-25, enforce public health rules adopted by the board through
19	the imposition of civil penalties. If a public health rule adopted by a board of county
20	commissioners imposes a civil penalty, the provisions of G.S. 130A-25 making its
21	violation a misdemeanor shall not be applicable to that public health rule unless the rule
22	states that a violation of the rule is a misdemeanor. The board of county commissioners
23	may exercise the power and authority herein conferred only after a public hearing held
24	by said board pursuant to 30 days' notice of said public hearing given in a newspaper
25	having general circulation in said county.
26	The board of county commissioners may also appoint advisory boards, committees

The board of county commissioners may also appoint advisory boards, committees, councils and agencies composed of qualified and interested county residents to study, interpret and develop community support and cooperation in activities conducted by or under the authority of the board of county commissioners of said county.

All members of the consolidated human services board shall be residents of the 1 2 county. The members of the board shall serve four-year terms. No member may serve 3 more than two consecutive four-year terms. The county commissioner member shall 4 serve only as long as the member is a county commissioner.

The initial board shall be appointed by the board of county commissioners upon the 5 6 recommendation of a nominating committee comprised of members of the 7 preconsolidation board of health, social services board, and area mental health, 8 developmental disabilities, and substance abuse services board. In order to establish a 9 uniform staggered term structure for the board, a member may be appointed for less 10 than a four-year term. After the subsequent establishment of the board, its board shall be 11 appointed by the board of county commissioners from nominees presented by the 12 human services board. Vacancies shall be filled for any unexpired portion of a term.

13 A chairperson shall be elected annually by the members of the consolidated human 14 services board. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. A member may be 15 removed from office by the county board of commissioners for (i) commission of a 16 felony or other crime involving moral turpitude; (ii) violation of a State law governing 17 conflict of interest; (iii) violation of a written policy adopted by the county board of 18 commissioners; (iv) habitual failure to attend meetings; (v) conduct that tends to bring the office into disrepute; or (vi) failure to maintain qualifications for appointment 19 20 required under this subsection. A board member may be removed only after the member 21 has been given written notice of the basis for removal and has had the opportunity to 22 respond.

23 A member may receive a per diem in an amount established by the county board of 24 commissioners. Reimbursement for subsistence and travel shall be in accordance with a 25 policy set by the county board of commissioners. The board shall meet at least 26 quarterly. The chairperson or three of the members may call a special meeting. 27

- 28 (1)Set fees for departmental services based upon recommendations of the 29 human services director. Fees set under this subdivision are subject to 30 the same restrictions on amount and scope that would apply if the fees 31 were set by a county board of health, a county board of social services, 32 or a mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse 33 area authority.

 - (3) Recommend creation of local human services programs.
 - (4) Adopt local health regulations and participate in enforcement appeals of local regulations.
 - (5) Perform regulatory health functions required by State law.
