6	SEC'	TION 1. The City of Concord may contract for construction of the
7	Speedway Area	a Infrastructure Projects without being subject to the requirements of
8	G.S. 143-128, 1	43-129, 143-131, and 143-132 provided that:
9	(1)	The City Council adopts a resolution approving the exemption of the
10		Speedway Area Infrastructure Projects from the competitive bidding
11		requirements of Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes.
12	(2)	The City Council complies with the minority business participation
13		requirements set forth in Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the General
14		Statutes.
15	(3)	The City Council conducts an annual independent audit of all contracts
16		for construction work that would otherwise be subject to the
17		competitive bidding requirements of Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the
18		General Statutes.
19	(4)	The City Council makes public any contracts awarded pursuant to this
20		act.
21	(5)	The City Council, after awarding a contract pursuant to this act,
22		prepares, places in the public files, and makes available to the public a
23		document setting forth the reasons for using the authority granted by
24		this act to award the contract.
25	(6)	The Speedway Area Infrastructure Projects comply with all applicable

27		TION 2. The City of Concord may contract with public and/or private
