The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. G.S. 90C-34 reads as rewritten:		
"§ 90C-34. Persons and practices not affected.  Nothing in this Chapter shall be construed to prevent or restrict:		
(2)	Any person qualified, registered, certified, or licensed to another profession or occupation or any person working supervision of a person registered, certified, or licensed to another profession or occupation in this State from perform incidental to the practice of that profession or occupation that person does not represent himself or herself as a therapy assistant or recreational therapist or the work to be therapy or therapeutic recreation as defined by this Chapter Any person employed as a therapeutic recreation specialist recreation assistant, or recreational therapist or a recreation assistant by the government of the United States, if he or therapeutic recreation or recreational therapy solely under and control of the organization by which he or she is employed.	ig under the to engage in orming work in as long as recreational recreational recreational therapeutic onal therapy she provides the direction
