A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT MEMBERS OF THE FIREMEN'S AND RESCUE SQUAD
3	WORKERS' PENSION FUND WHO WITHDRAW FROM MEMBERSHIP WITH FIVE
4	YEARS OR MORE OF CONTRIBUTING SERVICE ARE ENTITLED TO THE
5	RETURN OF ALL FUNDS.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 58-86-60(4) reads as rewritten:
8	"(4) Any member with five or more years of contributing service and who
9	withdraws withdrawing from the fund shall, upon proper application, be paid
10	all moneys the individual contributed to the fund without accumulated
11	earnings on the payments after the time they were made less an
12	administrative fee equal to the lesser of the amount the individual
13	contributed to the fund or twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The administrative
14	fees collected by the fund shall be retained by the Board to defray
15	administrative expenses, including salaries. Notwithstanding the foregoing,
16	if any If any member who has less than five years of contributing service
17	made contributions, or any person, firm, corporation, or other entity has
18	made contributions on behalf of a-that member and that member withdraws
19	from the fund, the <u>member</u> , person, firm, corporation, or other entity shall be
20	entitled to a refund equal to the amount of contributions made by them after
21	the Board has been notified of the contributor's desire to be refunded its
22	contributions upon the member's withdrawal. Any refunds to a contributor
23	other than a member shall also be subject to the twenty-five dollar (\$25.00)
24	administrative fee. If a refund is to be shared by a member and another party
25	the administrative fee shall be applied to each portion on a pro rata basis."
26	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
