- voluntary furlough period, the public employer shall pay both employee and employer contributions to the Retirement Systems Division on behalf of the voluntarily furloughed employee as though the employee were in active service.
- (2) A member of the State Health Plan for Teachers and State Employees shall be considered eligible for coverage under the Plan on the same basis as on the workday immediately preceding the furlough. The public employer shall pay contributions on behalf of the voluntarily furloughed employee as though the employee were in active service.
- (d) Public employees in essential positions are eligible to participate in the voluntary furlough program only if specifically authorized by the head of the public agency."

SECTION 2. G.S. 126-5 is amended by adding the following subsection to read:

- "(c12) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the provisions of G.S. 126-8.6 shall apply to all exempt and nonexempt employees in the executive, legislative, and judicial branches; to employees of The University of North Carolina; to employees of the North Carolina Community College System; and to employees of local school administrative units."
- **SECTION 3.** The State Personnel Commission, in consultation with the Office of State Budget and Management, shall adopt emergency rules for the implementation of this act in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.1A, except that notwithstanding G.S. 150B-21.1A(d), those emergency rules may remain in effect until July 30, 2010.

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
