The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:					
SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-325(o) reads as rewritten:

			employee's license. This license surrender shall not exceed 45 days		
			from the date of resignation. Provided further that the cessation of the		
			license surrender shall not prevent the State Board of Education from		
			taking any further action it deems appropriate. The State Board of		
			Education shall initiate investigation within five working days of the		
			written notice from the superintendent and shall make a final		
			decision as to whether to revoke or suspend the employee's certificate		
			within 45 days from the date of resignation.

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to career employees who resign on or after that date.
