24	(a) The Emergency Management Training and Standards Advisory Board shall issue		
25	documentation of certification, in a form and manner prescribed by the Division, to each		
26	applicant within North Carolina demonstrating successful completion of the requirements for		
27	the level of certification sought by the applicant.		
28	(b) The Board may issue documentation of certification to any person in another state		
29	or territory if the person's qualifications were, at the date of registration or certification,		
30	substantially equivalent to the requirements established pursuant to this Article.		
31	(c) Every person certified pursuant to this Article who desires to maintain certification		
32	shall apply for renewal of certification within five years of the date of original certification or		
33	certification renewal.		
34	(d) Renewal of Type I (advanced) certification is subject to completion of at least 24		
35	hours of continuing education requirements as established by the Board.		
36	(e) <u>A certification that is not renewed in accordance with this section automatically</u>		
37	expires. The Board may approve reinstatement of an expired certification upon good cause		
38	shown by the applicant.		
39	(f) <u>Certifications that have expired for more than five years shall not be reinstated.</u> "		
40	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
