1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO EXPAND THE LIST OF FELONIES FOR WHICH A DNA SAMPLE SHALL  
3 BE TAKEN UPON ARREST.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 15A-266.3A(f) reads as rewritten:

6 "(f) This section shall apply to a person arrested for violating any one of the following  
7 offenses in Chapter 14 of the General Statutes:

8 (1) G.S. 14-17, First and Second Degree Murder.

9 (2) G.S. 14-18, Manslaughter.

10 (3) Any offense in Article 7A, Rape and Other Sex Offenses.

11 (4) G.S. 14-32, Felonious assault with deadly weapon with intent to kill or  
12 inflicting serious injury; G.S. 14-32.1(e), Assault on handicapped person;  
13 G.S. 14-32.2, Patient abuse and neglect; G.S. 14-32.4(a), Assault inflicting  
14 serious bodily injury; G.S. 14-34.1, Discharging certain barreled weapons or  
15 a firearm into occupied property; G.S. 14-34.2, Assault with a firearm or  
16 other deadly weapon upon governmental officers or employees, company  
17 police officers, or campus police officers; G.S. 14-34.4, Adulterated or  
18 misbranded food, drugs, or cosmetics; intent to cause serious injury or death;  
19 intent to extort; G.S. 14-34.5, Assault with a firearm on a law enforcement,  
20 probation, or parole officer or on a person employed at a State or local  
21 detention facility; G.S. 14-34.6, Assault or affray on a firefighter, an  
22 emergency medical technician, medical responder, emergency department  
23 nurse, or emergency department physician; and G.S. 14-34.7, Assault  
24 inflicting serious injury on a law enforcement, probation, or parole officer or  
25 on a person employed at a State or local detention ~~facility~~facility;  
26 G.S. 14-34.9, Discharging a weapon from within an enclosure.

27 (5) Any offense in Article 10, Kidnapping and Abduction, or Article 10A,  
28 Human Trafficking.

29 (5a) Any offense in Article 13, Malicious Injury or Damage by Use of Explosive  
30 or Incendiary Device or Material.

31 (5b) G.S. 14-50.18, Soliciting; encouraging participation of minor.

32 (6) G.S. 14-51, First and second degree burglary; G.S. 14-53, Breaking out of  
33 dwelling house burglary; G.S. 14-54.1, Breaking or entering a place of  
34 religious worship; and G.S. 14-57, Burglary with explosives.

35 (7) Any offense in Article 15, Arson.

2 law robbery.
- 3 (8a) G.S. 14-190.7, Dissemination to minors under the age of 16 years;  
4 G.S. 14-190.8, Dissemination to minors under the age of 13 years.
- 5 (9) Any offense which would require the person to register under the provisions  
6 of Article 27A of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes, Sex Offender and  
7 Public Protection Registration Programs.
- 8 (10) G.S. 14-196.3, Cyberstalking.
- 9 (10a) G.S. 14-208.44(a) and (b), Failure to enroll in a satellite-based monitoring  
10 program; tampering with device.
- 11 (11) G.S. 14-277.3A, Stalking.
- 12 (12) G.S. 14-315(a1), Selling or giving weapons (handguns) to minors.
- 13 (13) G.S. 14-318.4, Child abuse a felony.
- 14 (14) G.S. 14-320.1, Transporting child outside the State with intent to violate  
15 custody order.
- 16 (15) Any felony offense under G.S. 14-321.1, Prohibit babysitting service by sex  
17 offender or in the home of a sex offender.
- 18 (16) G.S. 14-322.1, Abandonment of child or children for six months.
- 19 (17) G.S. 90-95(h), Trafficking in a controlled substance."

20 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2011, and applies to  
21 offenses committed on or after that date.
