1	A SENATE RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING ALL NORTH CAROLINIANS TO
2	CELEBRATE CINCO DE MAYO.
3	Whereas, Cinco de Mayo, or the fifth of May, is considered and remembered as a
4	significant date in the history of Mexico because it recognizes the courage of the Mexican
5	people who defeated a better trained and better equipped French Army at the "Batalla de
6	Puebla" on May 5, 1862; and
7	Whereas, Cinco de Mayo serves as an important reason for many North Carolinians
8	of Mexican ancestry to celebrate a holiday in appreciation of its cultural significance (victory in
9	the face of great odds); and
10	Whereas, Cinco de Mayo offers an opportunity to reflect on the courage and
11	achievements not only of the Mexican forces at Puebla, but also on the courage and
12	achievements of North Carolinians of Mexican ancestry; and
13	Whereas, Mexicans, Hispanics, and Latinos have contributed to our State through a
14	broad spectrum of cultural expressions, including music, food, dance, faith, and family unity;
15	and
16	Whereas, according to the 2010 Census, 50.5 million Hispanics accounted for
17	16.3% of the total population in the United States; and
18	Whereas, the 2010 Census also revealed that North Carolina's Hispanic population
19	increased by 110%; and
20	Whereas, North Carolina is one of five states in the United States with the largest
21	growth in the percentage of Hispanic populations; and
22	Whereas, many Hispanics and Latinos in North Carolina, particularly small business
23	entrepreneurs, represent one of the fastest growing groups of business owners in our economy;
24	and
25	Whereas, North Carolina benefits from a vibrant Hispanic and Latino community
26	that plays an integral role in the enrichment of our society and growth of our economy; and
27	Whereas, it is our desire to recognize all of North Carolina's ethnic groups along
28	with their contributions and dedication to the economies of North Carolina and the United
29	States; Now, therefore,
30	Be it resolved by the Senate:
31	SECTION 1. The Senate extends best wishes to the State's residents of Mexican,
32	Hispanic, and Latino ancestry and urges all North Carolinians to join in celebrating Cinco de
33	Mayo.
34	SECTION 2. This resolution is effective upon adoption.
