4	Whereas, some of North Carolina's official State symbols have been sugge	ested by
5	the State's school children after they have had history, science, social studies, or ge	ography
6	lessons related to North Carolina; and	
7	Whereas, this year some of the suggestions range from the adoption of an	official
8	fossil to an official frog; and	
9	Whereas, the State of North Carolina has a number of unique official sym	bols but
10	does not have an official fossil, frog, salamander, marsupial, or folk art; and	·
11 12	Whereas, the megalodon shark is an extinct shark species that lived over 1.5	million
12	years ago; and Whereas, the megalodon shark may have reached over 40 feet in len	oth and
13 14	whereas, the megalouon shark may have reached over 40 reet in len weighed up to 100 tons; and	gui allu
15	Whereas, the megalodon shark had serrated, heart-shaped teeth that ma	av have

19	Whereas, North Carolina and the Southeast region of the United States	lead the
20	world in amphibian diversity; and	
21	Whereas, the pine barrens tree frog can be found in the Sandhills and Coast	tal Plain
22	regions of North Carolina; and	
23	Whereas, the pine barrens tree frog has been considered one of the most stril	king and
24	beautiful frogs in the Southeast region of the United States; and	
25	Whereas, the pine barrens tree frog by name reflects one of North C	
26	signature trees and ecosystems that have been a vital part of the State's economic, cultu	iral, and
27	natural history since colonial times; and	•••
28	Whereas, North Carolina also leads the nation and world in salamander d	iversity,
29 30	most notably in our Appalachian Mountains; and Whereas, the marbled salamander is found throughout the State and is uniqu	a in that
30 31	it is a charismatic, striking, chunky-bodied, fossorial amphibian, of which no two are	
32	alike in color pattern; and	cracity

1 2	Whereas, according the North Carolina Wildlife Commission's 2005 North Carolina Wildlife Action Plan, the pine barrens tree frog and the marbled salamander have been
2 3	identified as priority species for population monitoring and conservation in North Carolina; and
4	Whereas, the Virginia opossum is native to North Carolina and is the only marsupial
5	found in North America; the female carries its underdeveloped young in a pouch until they are
6	capable of living independently, similar to a kangaroo; and
7	Whereas, the Virginia opossum is one of the oldest and most primitive species of
8	mammal found in North America; and
9	Whereas, the opossum is about the size of a large house cat with a triangular head; a
10	long pointed nose; dark eyes; a long, scaly, prehensile tail; and short, black, leathery ears; and
11	Whereas, the Virginia opossum is nocturnal and lives in a wide variety of habitats,
12	including deciduous forests, open woods, and farmland but prefers wet areas such as marshes,
13	swamps, and streams; and
14	Whereas, at age 65, Vollis Simpson, a self-taught folk artist, began making giant
15	windmills known as "whirligigs" at his home in Wilson, North Carolina; and
16 17	Whereas, Mr. Simpson's whirligigs have been exhibited at the North Carolina Museum of Art in Raleigh, the High Museum of Art in Atlanta, Georgia, and the Visionary Art
17	Museum of Art in Kaleigh, the fligh Museum of Art in Atlanta, Georgia, and the Visionary Art Museum in Baltimore, Maryland, and at other locations, including New York, California,
19	Canada, and England; and
20	Whereas, Mr. Simpson and details of his artwork have been featured in many
21	national magazines and in several books; and
22	Whereas, the City of Wilson is developing the Vollis Simpson Whirligig Park to
23	display a large collection of these whirligigs in historic downtown, which will be a
24	one-of-a-kind destination for visitors; Now, therefore,
25	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
26	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Chapter 145 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the
27	following new sections to read:
28	" <u>§ 145-41. State fossil.</u> The feasilized tests of the mageleder shorts is adorted as the official feasil of the State of
29 30	<u>The fossilized teeth of the megalodon shark is adopted as the official fossil of the State of</u> North Carolina.
30 31	"§ 145-42. State frog.
32	The pine barrens tree frog (Hyla andersonii) is adopted as the official frog of the State of
33	North Carolina.
34	"§ 145-43. State salamander.
35	The marbled salamander (Ambystoma opacum) is adopted as the official salamander of the
36	State of North Carolina.
37	"§ 145-44. State marsupial.
38	The Virginia opossum (Didelphis virginiana) is adopted as the official marsupial of the
39	State of North Carolina.
40	" <u>§ 145-45. State folk art.</u>
41	The whirligigs created by Vollis Simpson are adopted as the official folk art of the State of
42	North Carolina."
43	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
