AN ACT TO INCLUDE MCDOWELL COUNTY SCHOOLS IN THE PILOT PROGRAM TO RAISE THE HIGH SCHOOL DROPOUT AGE FROM SIXTEEN TO EIGHTEEN.

RAISE THE HIGH SCHOOL DROPOUT AGE F
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Section 8.21 of S.L. 2016-94 reads as rewritten:

6 "PILOT PROGRAM TO RAISE THE HIGH SCHOOL DROPOUT AGE FROM SIXTEEN 7 TO EIGHTEEN

8 "SECTION 8.21.(a) Notwithstanding any provisions in Part 1 of Article 26 of Chapter 115C 9 of the General Statutes, G.S. 7B-1501(27), 115C-238.66(3), 116-235(b)(2), and 143B-805(20) to 10 the contrary, the State Board of Education shall authorize the Hickory Public Schools, the 11 Newton-Conover City Schools, and the Rutherford County Schools, Schools, and the McDowell 12 County Schools to establish and implement a pilot program pursuant to this section to increase the 13 high school dropout age from 16 years of age to the completion of the school year coinciding with 14 the calendar year in which a student reaches 18 years of age, unless the student has previously 15 graduated from high school. The pilot program may be implemented beginning with the 2016-2017 school year for the Hickory Public Schools, Newton-Conover City Schools, and 16 17 Rutherford County Schools, and beginning with the 2017-2018 school year for the McDowell 18 County Schools, and may continue for subsequent school years following the end of the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium. 19

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21 "SECTION 8.21.(f) Each local school administrative unit may use any funds available to it to 22 implement the pilot program in accordance with this section to (i) employ up to three additional 23 teachers and (ii) fund additional student-related costs, such as transportation and technology costs, 24 including additional computers, to serve a greater number of students as a result of the pilot 25 program. Each local school administrative unit may also use any funds available to it to operate a 26 night school program for students at risk of dropping out of high school. For Hickory Public 27 Schools and Newton-Conover City Schools, to the extent possible, the local school administrative 28 units shall partner with Catawba Valley Community College in administering the pilot program. 29 For Rutherford County Schools, to the extent possible, the local school administrative unit shall 30 partner with Isothermal Community College in administering the pilot program. For McDowell 31 County Schools, to the extent possible, the local school administrative unit shall partner with 32 McDowell Technical Community College in administering the pilot program.

"SECTION 8.21.(g) The local school administrative units, in collaboration with the State
Board of Education, shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, the
House Appropriations Subcommittee on Education, and the Senate Appropriations Committee on
Education/Higher Education by January 15, 2018, and by January 15 of each even-numbered year

19 "SECTION 8.21.(h) The State Board of Education shall not authorize a pilot program under					
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21	adopted by the boards of education for the Hickory Public Schools and the Newton-Conover City				
22	Schools setting forth a date to begin establishment and implementation of the pilot program. The				
23	State Board of Education shall not authorize a pilot program under subsection (a) of this section in				
24	Rutherford County except upon receipt of a copy of a resolution adopted by the board of education				
25	for the Rutherford County Schools setting forth a date to begin establishment and implementation				
26	of the pilot program. The State Board of Education shall not authorize a pilot program under				
27	subsection (a) of this section in McDowell County except upon receipt of a copy of a resolution				
28	adopted by the board of education for the McDowell County Schools setting forth a date to begin				
29	establishment and implementation of the pilot program."				
30	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
