2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A TRAINING PROGRAM ON YOUTH SUICIDE 3 AWARENESS AND PREVENTION AND RISK REFERRAL PROTOCOL FOR 4 SCHOOL PERSONNEL. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6 **SECTION 1.** Article 25A of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by 7 adding a new section to read: 8 "§ 115C-375.10. Youth suicide awareness and prevention training and risk referral 9 protocol for school personnel. 10 State Board Training Program and Protocol. - The State Board of Education, in (a) consultation with the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, 11 12 shall develop a youth suicide awareness and prevention training program and a model risk referral protocol for local school administrative units and charter schools to provide to school 13 personnel who work directly with students in grades K through 12, including teachers, teacher 14 assistants, bus drivers, cafeteria workers, janitorial staff, media coordinators, athletic coaches, 15 16 administrators, administrative assistants, school safety resource officers, school nurses, social workers, psychologists, and counselors. The training program shall consist of at least two hours 17 of evidence-informed instruction to increase awareness of suicide, identification of risk factors 18 19 and signs, and information for student referral for suicide prevention resources and support. The model risk referral protocol shall provide guidelines to local school administrative units on 20 21 identification of at-risk students, suicide prevention procedures, and referral sources. The 22 training program and model risk referral protocol shall be periodically reviewed and updated as 23 necessary. 24 Training and Protocol Requirements. – Each local school administrative unit shall (b) 25 provide the training program and model risk referral protocol developed by the State Board of 26 Education under subsection (a) of this section, or a locally developed plan that meets the requirements of subsection (c) of this section, to school personnel who work directly with 27 28 students in grades K through 12 at no cost to the employee. A school employee who works directly with students in grades K through 12 shall receive training within 12 months of 29 employment with a local board of education and annually thereafter while employed with that 30 31 local board of education. The training may be offered in various formats, including electronically, through videoconferencing, or through an individual program of study of 32 designated materials consisting of at least two hours of instruction. 33 Locally Developed Training and Risk Referral Protocols. - A local board of 34 (c) 35 education may comply with the training and protocol requirements of this section by
