A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE APPOINTMENT OF A PEDIATRICIAN TO THE

- NORTH CAROLINA CHILD-CARE COMMISSION.
- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. G.S. 143B-168.4 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 143B-168.4. Child Day-Care Commission – members; selection; quorum.

The Child Day-Care Commission of the Department of Human Resources shall 7 consist of 15 members. Seven of the members shall be appointed by the Governor and 8 eight by the General Assembly, four upon the recommendation of the President of the 9 Senate, and four upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of 10 Representatives. Four of the members appointed by the Governor, two by the General 11 Assembly on the recommendation of the President of the Senate, and two by the 12 General Assembly on the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of 13 14 Representatives, shall be members of the public who are not employed in, or providing, day care and who have no financial interest in a day care facility or home. Two of the 15 foregoing public members appointed by the Governor, one of the foregoing public 16 17 members recommended by the President of the Senate, and one of the foregoing public members recommended by the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be parents 18 of children receiving day care services. Of the remaining two public members 19 appointed by the Governor, one shall be a pediatrician currently licensed to practice in 20 21 North Carolina. Three of the members appointed by the Governor shall be day care providers, one of whom shall be affiliated with a for profit day care facility, one of 22 whom shall be affiliated with a for profit day care home, and one of whom shall be 23

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1	affiliated with a nonprofit home or facility. Two of the members appointed by the
2	General Assembly on the recommendation of the President of the Senate, and two by
3	the General Assembly on recommendation of the Speaker of the House of
4	Representatives, shall be day care providers, one affiliated with a for profit day care
5	facility or home, and one affiliated with a nonprofit day care facility or home. None
6	may be employees of the State. Members shall be appointed as follows:
7	(1) Of the Governor's initial appointees, four shall be appointed for terms
8	expiring June 30, 1986, and three shall be appointed for terms expiring
9	June 30, 1987;
10	(2) Of the General Assembly's initial appointees appointed upon
11	recommendation of the President of the Senate, two shall be appointed
12	for terms expiring June 30, 1986, and two shall be appointed for terms
13	expiring June 30, 1987;
14	(3) Of the General Assembly's initial appointees appointed upon
15	recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, two
16	shall be appointed for terms expiring June 30, 1986, and two shall be
17	appointed for terms expiring June 30, 1987.
18	Appointments by the General Assembly shall be made in accordance with G.S. 120-
19	121. After the initial appointees' terms have expired, all members shall be appointed to
20	serve two-year terms. Any appointment to fill a vacancy on the Commission created by
21	the resignation, dismissal, death, or disability of a member shall be for the balance of
22	the unexpired term.
23	A vacancy occurring during a term of office is filled:
24	(1) By the Governor, if the Governor made the initial appointment;
25	(2) By the General Assembly, if the General Assembly made the initial
26	appointment in accordance with G.S. 120-122.
27	At its first meeting the Commission members shall elect a chairman to serve a two-
28	year term. Chairmen shall be elected for two-year terms thereafter. The same member
29	may serve as chairman for two consecutive terms.
30	Commission members may be reappointed and may succeed themselves for a
31	maximum of four consecutive terms.
32	The Commission shall meet quarterly, and at other times at the call of the chairman
33	or upon written request of at least six members.
34	The members of the Commission shall receive per diem and necessary travel and
35	subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5. A majority of the
36	Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
37	All clerical and other services required by the Commission shall be supplied by the
38	Secretary of Human Resources."
39	Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification and applies to appointments to
40	be made on and after that date.
