11	(10) Age 70 Lifetime Sportsman Combination Hunting-Fishing License –
12	\$10.00. This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of
13	the State who has attained the age of 70 years. The license is valid for
14	the life of the individual.
15	(11) Totally Disabled Resident Combination Hunting-Fishing License -
16	\$7.50. This license is valid only for use of an individual resident of the
17	State who is totally disabled (physically incapable of being gainfully
18	employed). This license is valid for the life of the individual so long as
19	he remains totally disabled."
