A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO ALLOW SINGLE PRIME CONTRACTOR PUBLIC CONTRACTS.
- 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. G.S. 143-128 reads as rewritten:

5 "§ 143-128. Separate specifications for building contracts; responsible contractors.

Every officer, board, department, commission or commissions charged with 6 (a) responsibility of preparation of specifications or awarding or entering into contracts for 7 the erection, construction, alteration or repair of any buildings for the State, or for any 8 county or municipality, when the entire cost of such work shall exceed one hundred 9 thousand dollars (\$100,000) must have prepared separate specifications for each of the 10 following subdivisions or branches of work to be performed: 11

- 12 Heating, ventilating, air conditioning and accessories (separately or (1)combined into one conductive system) and/or refrigeration for cold 13 storage (where the cooling load is 15 tons or more of refrigeration), 14 15 and all work kindred thereto.
- Plumbing and gas fittings and accessories, and all work kindred 16 (2)thereto. 17
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- Electrical wiring and installations, and all work kindred thereto. (3)
- (4) General work relating to the erection, construction, alteration, or repair of any building above referred to, which work is not included in the 21 above-listed three subdivisions or branches.

22 All such specifications must be so drawn as to permit separate and independent bidding upon each of the subdivisions or branches of work enumerated above. The 23 above enumeration of subdivisions or branches of work shall not be construed to 24

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prevent any officer, board, department, commission or commissions from preparing
additional separate specifications and awarding additional separate contracts for any
other category of work when it is deemed in the best interest of such officer, board,
department, commission or commissions to do so.

5 All contracts hereafter awarded by the State or by a county or municipality, or a 6 department, board, commissioner, or officer thereof, for the erection, construction, 7 alteration or repair of buildings, or any parts thereof, shall award the respective work 8 specified separately to responsible and reliable persons, firms or corporations regularly 9 engaged in their respective lines of work. When the estimated cost of work to be 10 performed in any single subdivision or branch is less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), the same may be included in the contract for one of the other subdivisions or 11 12 branches of the work, irrespective of total project cost.

13 Each separate contractor shall be directly liable to the State of North Carolina, or to 14 the county or municipality, and to the other separate contractors for the full performance 15 of all duties and obligations due respectively under the terms of the separate contracts 16 and in accordance with the plans and specifications, which shall specifically set forth 17 the duties and obligations of each separate contractor. For the purpose of this section, 18 the wording 'separate contractor' is hereby deemed and held to mean any person, firm or 19 corporation who shall enter into a contract with the State, or with any county or 20 municipality, for the erection, construction, alteration or repair of any building or 21 buildings, or parts thereof.

All public authorities coming within the requirements of this section shall have the authority to purchase and erect prefabricated or relocatable buildings or portions thereof without complying with the provisions hereof, except that portion of the work which must be performed at the construction site.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section a county. 26 27 municipality, department, board, commissioner, officer, or public hospital board of trustees may use the single prime contract system, and may prequalify bidders, for all 28 construction contracts. Provided, however, that all bidders must identify on their bid the 29 30 electrical, plumbing, and mechanical contractors they have selected. If the contract is to be let under this subsection, each bidder shall include minority business subcontractors 31 in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the prospective prime contractor's total 32 33 bid, or shall verify why that bidder was unable to secure qualified minority subcontractors in such an amount." 34 35 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
