AN ACT TO LIMIT TO FOUR YEARS SERVICE OF THE SPEAKER AND
SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
Article to read:
"ARTICLE 22.
"LIMITATION ON TERMS OF SPEAKER AND SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE.
"§ 120-191. Limitation to four years for term of Speaker.
(a) No person may serve as Speaker in more than two consecutive General
Assemblies. The initial convening of each regular session shall constitute a new
General Assembly for the purpose of this section. Service as Speaker during any part of
the term of a General Assembly shall constitute service as Speaker for that General
Assembly for the purpose of this section.
(b) If any person is barred by subsection (a) of this section from serving in the
next consecutive General Assembly as Speaker, that person may not serve as Speaker

"§ 120-192. Limitation to four years for term of Speaker Pro Tempore.

20 (a) No person may serve as Speaker Pro Tempore in more than two consecutive
21 General Assemblies. The initial convening of each regular session shall constitute a

23 during any part of the term of a General Assembly shall constitute service as Speaker
