A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 2 AN ACT TO TRANSFER THE DIVISIONS OF COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE AND 3 ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT 4 OF COMMERCE, TO DIRECT THE SECRETARY OF COMMERCE TO 5 ESTABLISH A DIVISION OF HOUSING, AND TO ESTABLISH A TOLL-FREE 6 TELEPHONE NUMBER FOR HOUSING ASSISTANCE INFORMATION IN 7 8 THAT DIVISION. 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 10 The Divisions of Community Assistance and Economic Section 1. Opportunity in the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development are 11 transferred to the Department of Commerce. The transfer shall have all the elements of 12 a Type I transfer, as that term is defined in G.S. 143A-6(a). 13 Sec. 2. The Secretary of Commerce shall establish a division of housing 14 15 within that department. The Divisions of Community Assistance and Economic Opportunity shall be located in this new division. 16 Sec. 3. G.S. 143B-431 reads as rewritten: 17 18 "§ 143B-431. Department of Commerce – functions. 19 The functions of the Department of Commerce, except as otherwise expressly (a) provided by Article 1 of this Chapter or by the Constitution of North Carolina, shall 20

- 21 include:
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(1) All of the executive functions of the State in relation to economic development including by way of enumeration and not of limitation, the expansion and recruitment of environmentally sound industry,

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1		labor force development, the promotion of and assistance in the
2		orderly development of North Carolina counties and communities, the
3		promotion and growth of the travel and tourism industries, the
4		development of our State's ports, energy resource management and
5		energy policy development;
6	(2)	All functions, powers, duties and obligations heretofore vested in any
7		agency enumerated in Article 15 of Chapter 143A, to wit:
8		a. The State Board of Alcoholic Control,
9		b. The North Carolina Utilities Commission,
10		c. The Employment Security Commission,
11		d. The North Carolina Industrial Commission,
12		e. State Banking Commission and the Commissioner of Banks,
13		f. Savings and Loan Association Division,
14		g. The State Savings and Loan Commission,
15		h. Credit Union Commission,
16		i. The North Carolina Milk Commission,
17		j. The North Carolina Mutual Burial Association Commission,
18		k. The North Carolina Rural Electrification Authority,
19		1. The North Carolina State Ports Authority, all of which
20		enumerated agencies are hereby expressly transferred by a Type
21		II transfer, as defined by G.S. 143A-6, to this recreated and
22		reconstituted Department of Commerce; and,
23	(3)	All other functions, powers, duties and obligations as are conferred by
24	(-)	this Chapter, delegated or assigned by the Governor and conferred by
25		the Constitution and laws of this State. Any agency transferred to the
26		Department of Commerce by a Type II transfer, as defined by G.S.
27		143A-6, shall have the authority to employ, direct and supervise
28		professional and technical personnel, and such agencies shall not be
29		accountable to the Secretary of Commerce in their exercise of quasi-
30		judicial powers authorized by statute, notwithstanding any other
31		provisions of this Chapter, provided that the authority of the North
32		Carolina State Ports Authority to employ, direct and supervise
33		personnel shall be as provided in Part 10 of this Article.
34	(b) The I	Department of Commerce is authorized to establish and provide for the
35		rth Carolina nonprofit corporations to achieve the purpose of aiding the
36	*	small businesses and to achieve the purposes of the United States Small
37	-	istration's 504 Certified Development Company Program.
38		e Department of Commerce shall have the following powers and duties
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 39 40 41 42 43 	with respect to 1 (1)	ocal planning assistance: <u>To provide planning assistance to municipalities and counties and join</u> <u>and regional planning boards established by two or more governmenta</u> <u>units in the solution of their local planning problems. Planning</u> <u>assistance as used in this section shall consist of making population</u>
44		economic, land use, traffic, and parking studies and developing plan

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1 2		based thereon to guide public and private development and other planning work of a similar nature. Planning assistance shall also
3		include the preparation of proposed subdivision regulations, zoning
4		ordinances, capital budgets, and similar measures that may be
5		recommended for the implementation of such plans. The term planning
6		assistance shall not be construed to include the providing of plans for
7		specific public works.
8	<u>(2)</u>	To receive and expend federal and other funds for planning assistance
9		to municipalities and counties and to joint and regional planning
10		boards, and to enter into contracts with the federal government,
11		municipalities, counties, or joint and regional planning boards with
12		reference thereto.
13	<u>(3)</u>	To perform planning assistance, either through the staff of the
14		Department or through acceptable contractual arrangements with other
15		qualified State agencies or institutions, local planning agencies, or with
16	(\mathbf{A})	private professional organizations or individuals.
17	<u>(4)</u>	To assume full responsibility for the proper execution of a planning
18 19		program for which a grant of State or federal funds has been made and
19 20	<u>(5)</u>	for carrying out the terms of a federal grant contract. To cooperate with municipal, county, joint and regional planning
20 21	<u>(5)</u>	boards, and federal agencies for the purpose of aiding and encouraging
21		an orderly, coordinated development of the State.
23	<u>(6)</u>	To establish and conduct, either with its own staff or through
24		contractual arrangements with institutions of higher education, State
25		agencies, or private agencies, training programs for those employed or
26		to be employed in community development activities."

9	"§ 143B-280. Board of Natural Resources and Community Development; duties;
10	members; selection; meetings; quorum; compensation; services.
11	The Board of Natural Resources and Community Development shall consider and
12	advise the Secretary of Natural Resources and Community Development upon any
13	matter that the Secretary may refer to it. The Board shall assist the Secretary of Natural
14	Resources and Community Development in the development of major programs and
15	recommend priorities for programs within the Department.
16	The Board of Natural Resources and Community Development shall perform such
17	other duties as may be specifically given to it.
18	The Board of Natural Resources and Community Development shall consist of the
19	following 20 members. The chairman of each of the following commissions: the
20	Wildlife Resources Commission, the Environmental Management Commission, the
21	Marine Fisheries Commission, the Coastal Resources Commission and the Soil and
22	Water Conservation Commission; the chairman of each of the following councils: the
23	Community Development Council, the Forestry Council, the Parks and Recreation
24	Council and the North Carolina Zoological Park Council; 10-11 members at large
25	appointed by the Governor to serve at his pleasure; and the Secretary of Natural
26	Resources and Community Development who shall be a member and chairman ex
27	officio. The Board of Natural Resources and Community Development shall meet at
28	least once in each quarter and may hold special meetings at any time and place within
29	the State at the call of its chairman.
30	A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
31	Members of the Board shall receive per diem and necessary travel expenses in
32	accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.
33	All clerical and other services required by the Board shall be supplied by the
34	Secretary of Natural Resources and Community Development."
35	Sec. 11. Part 11 of G.S. 143B, Sections 143B-305 to 143B-307, is repealed.
36	Sec. 12. There shall be established in the Department of Commerce, Housing
37	Division, a toll-free telephone number to provide information on housing assistance to
38	the citizens of the State.
39	Sec. 13. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.

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
