A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO TRANSFER THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND COMMUNITY 3 DEVELOPMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, TO TRANSFER 4 5 THE DIVISION OF ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO THE 6 7 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES, TO DIRECT THE SECRETARY OF 8 COMMERCE TO ESTABLISH THE FUNCTIONS OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING, TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE 9 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC 10 AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE 11 SECRETARY OF COMMERCE TO THE SECRETARY OF ECONOMIC AND 12 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, AND TO ESTABLISH A TOLL-FREE 13 TELEPHONE NUMBER FOR HOUSING ASSISTANCE INFORMATION 14 15 WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. The Division of Community Assistance in the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development is transferred to the Department of Commerce, as renamed the Department of Economic and Community Development pursuant to this act. The Division of Economic Opportunity in the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development is transferred to the Department of

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Human Resources. The transfers shall have all the elements of a Type I transfer, as that term is defined in G.S. 143A-6(a).

Sec. 2. The Secretary of Commerce, as renamed the Secretary of Economic and Community Development pursuant to this act, shall establish the functions of community development and housing and shall establish the position of Deputy or Assistant Secretary for Community Development and Housing within the Department, which Deputy or Assistant Secretary shall be of the same status and position as the Deputy or Assistant Secretary for Economic Development. The functions of the transferred Division of Community Assistance shall be located under the Deputy or Assistant Secretary for Community Development and Housing.

Consistent with the provisions of this act, the Codifier of Statutes is hereby authorized to change the name of the North Carolina Department of Commerce to the Department of Economic and Community Development and the name of the Secretary of Commerce to the Secretary of Economic and Community Development in (i) any general statute not listed in sections 3 or 4 of this act and (ii) any session law currently in effect which is not otherwise covered by the lists in sections 3 or 4 of this act.

Any agency transferred to the Department of Commerce-Economic and Community Development by a Type II transfer, as defined by G.S. 143A-6, shall have the authority to employ, direct and supervise professional and technical personnel. and such agencies shall not be accountable to the Secretary of Commerce-Economic and Community Development in their exercise of quasi-judicial powers authorized by statute, notwithstanding any other provisions of this Chapter, provided that the authority of the North Carolina State Ports Authority to employ, direct and supervise personnel shall be as provided in Part 10 of this Article.
  - The Department of Commerce-Economic and Community Development is (b) authorized to establish and provide for the operation of North Carolina nonprofit corporations to achieve the purpose of aiding the development of small businesses and to achieve the purposes of the United States Small Business Administration's 504 Certified Development Company Program.
  - (c) The Department of Economic and Community Development shall have the following powers and duties with respect to local planning assistance:
    - To provide planning assistance to municipalities and counties and joint (1) and regional planning boards established by two or more governmental units in the solution of their local planning problems. Planning assistance as used in this section shall consist of making population, economic, land use, traffic, and parking studies and developing plans based thereon to guide public and private development and other planning work of a similar nature. Planning assistance shall also include the preparation of proposed subdivision regulations, zoning ordinances, capital budgets, and similar measures that may be recommended for the implementation of such plans. The Council shall consider and advise the Secretary of Economic and Community Development upon any matter the Secretary may refer to it.

## "§ 143B-438.2. Council membership; compensation; procedures.

The Community Development Council of the Department of Economic and Community Development shall consist of 11 members appointed by the Governor. The composition of the Council shall be as follows: one member who shall be a local government official, one member who shall be the Executive Secretary of the League of Municipalities, one member who shall be the Executive Secretary of the County Commissioners Association, one member who shall represent industry, one member who shall represent labor, and six members at large.

The Governor shall designate one member of the Council as chairman to serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

The initial members of the Council other than those members serving in an ex officio capacity shall be appointed to serve for terms of four years and until their successors are appointed and qualified. Any appointment to fill a vacancy on the Council created by the resignation, dismissal, death, or disability of a member shall be for the balance of the unexpired term.

The Governor shall have the power to remove any member of the Council from office in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 143B-16 of the Executive Organization Act of 1973.

Members of the Council may receive per diem and necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.

A majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

All clerical and other services required by the Council shall be supplied by the Secretary of Economic and Community Development.

#### "§ 143B-438.3. Council meetings.

The Community Development Council shall meet at least semiannually and may hold special meetings at any time and place within the State at the call of the chairman or upon the written request of at least a majority of the members."

- All members except those serving ex officio shall be appointed by the Secretary of Economic and Community Development. The Secretary of Economic and Community Development shall designate one member of the Council to serve as Chair.
  - (b) The initial members of the Council other than those serving ex officio shall be appointed to serve for terms of four years and until their successors are appointed and qualified. Any appointment to fill a vacancy created by resignation, dismissal, death, or disability of a member shall be for the balance of the term.
  - (c) Members of the Council may receive per diem and necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.
  - (d) A majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
  - (e) All clerical and other services required by the Council shall be supplied by the Secretary of Economic and Community Development.

## "§ 143B-438.6. Council meetings; report.

- (a) The Housing Coordination and Policy Council shall meet at least quarterly and may hold special meetings at any time and place within the State at the call of the Chair or upon written request of a majority of the members.
- (b) The Council shall assist in the preparation and filing of an annual written report which contains a review of work completed, a review of ongoing activities, and housing policy recommendations. This report shall be filed with the General Assembly and the Governor by May 1. The report to the 1991 Session of the General Assembly shall contain specific recommendations regarding the further consolidation of housing programs within State government."
  - Sec. 11. G.S. 143-320 reads as rewritten:

## **"§ 143-320. Definitions.**

As used in this Article, unless the context otherwise requires:

'Council' means the Community Development Council.

'Department' means the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development.

'Secretary' means the Secretary of Natural Resources and Community Development.

'Recreation' means those interests that are diversionary in character and that aid in promoting entertainment, pleasure, relaxation, instruction, and other physical, mental, and cultural developments and experiences of a leisure nature, and includes all governmental, private nonprofit and commercial recreation forms of the recreation field and includes parks, conservation, recreation travel, the use of natural resources, wilderness and high density recreation types and the variety of recreation interests in areas and programs which are incorporated in this range."

Sec. 12. G.S. 143-323(c) is repealed.

Sec. 13. G.S. 143B-279(10) is repealed.

Sec. 14. G.S. 143B-280 reads as rewritten:

"§ 143B-280. Board of Natural Resources and Community Development; duties; members; selection; meetings; quorum; compensation; services.

The Board of Natural Resources and Community Development shall consider and advise the Secretary of Natural Resources and Community Development upon any matter that the Secretary may refer to it. The Board shall assist the Secretary of Natural Resources and Community Development in the development of major programs and recommend priorities for programs within the Department.

The Board of Natural Resources and Community Development shall perform such other duties as may be specifically given to it.

The Board of Natural Resources and Community Development shall consist of the following 20 members. The chairman of each of the following commissions: the Wildlife Resources Commission, the Environmental Management Commission, the Marine Fisheries Commission, the Coastal Resources Commission and the Soil and Water Conservation Commission; the chairman of each of the following councils: the Community Development Council,—the Forestry Council, the Parks and Recreation Council and the North Carolina Zoological Park Council; 10–11 members at large appointed by the Governor to serve at his pleasure; and the Secretary of Natural Resources and Community Development who shall be a member and chairman ex officio. The Board of Natural Resources and Community Development shall meet at least once in each quarter and may hold special meetings at any time and place within the State at the call of its chairman.

A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Members of the Board shall receive per diem and necessary travel expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.

All clerical and other services required by the Board shall be supplied by the Secretary of Natural Resources and Community Development."

Sec. 15. G.S. 143B-305 through 143B-307 are repealed.

Sec. 16. There shall be established in the Department of Economic and Community Development a toll-free telephone number to provide information on housing assistance to the citizens of the State.

Sec. 17. Nothing herein shall require the State to appropriate funds to implement the provisions of this act.

Sec. 18. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
