1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE NORTH CAROLINA TEACHER OF THE YEAR
3	TO SERVE AS AN ADVISORY MEMBER TO THE STATE BOARD OF
4	EDUCATION.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 115C-11 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 115C-11. Organization and internal procedures of Board.
8	(a) Presiding Officer. The State Board of Education shall elect from its
9	membership a chairman and vice-chairman. A majority of the Board shall constitute a
10	quorum for the transaction of business. Per diem and expenses of the appointive
11	members of the Board shall be provided by the General Assembly. The chairman of the
12	Board shall preside at all meetings of the Board. In the absence of the chairman, the
13	vice-chairman shall preside; in the absence of both the chairman and the vice-chairman,
14	the Board shall name one of its own members as chairman pro tempore.
15	(a1) Student advisors – The Governor is hereby authorized to appoint two high
16	school students who are enrolled in the public schools of North Carolina as advisors to
17	the State Board of Education. The student advisors shall participate in State Board
18	deliberations in an advisory capacity only. The State Board may, in its discretion,
19	exclude the student advisors from executive sessions.

The Governor shall make initial appointments of student advisors to the State Board as follows:

1	(1) One high school junior shall be appointed for a two-year term
2	beginning September 1, 1986, and expiring June 14, 1988; and
3	(2) One high school senior shall be appointed for a one-year term
4	beginning September 1, 1986, and expiring June 14, 1987. When an
5	initial or subsequent term expires, the Governor shall appoint a high school junior for a two year term beginning lung 15 of that year. If a
6 7	school junior for a two-year term beginning June 15 of that year. If a
/ 8	student advisor is no longer enrolled in the public schools of North Carolina or if a vacancy otherwise occurs, the Governor shall appoint a
8 9	student advisor for the remainder of the unexpired term.
10	Student advisor for the remainder of the unexpired term. Student advisors shall receive per diem and necessary travel and subsistence
11	expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.
12	(a2) State Teacher of the Year Advisor.—Each State Teacher of the Year, as
13	designated by the Department of Public Instruction, shall serve ex officio as advisor to
14	the State Board of Education. Each State Teacher of the Year shall begin service as
15	advisory member to the State Board at the commencement of the teacher's term as State
16	Teacher of the Year and shall serve for two years. The State Teachers of the Year shall
17	participate in State Board deliberations and committee meetings in an advisory capacity
18	only. The State Board may, in its discretion, exclude the State Teachers of the Year
19	from executive sessions.
20	In the event a vacancy occurs in the State Teacher of the Year's advisory position,
21	the teacher who was next runner-up to that State Teacher of the Year shall serve as the
22	advisory member to the Board for the remainder of the unexpired term. The State
23	Teacher of the Year advisors to the State Board shall receive per diem and necessary
24	travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.
25	(b) Regular Meetings of Board. – The regular meetings of the Board shall be held
26	each month on a day certain, as determined by the Board. The Board shall determine the
27	hour of the meeting, which may be adjourned from day to day, or to a day certain, until
28	the business before the Board has been completed.
29	(b1) Annual meeting with the State Board of Community Colleges and the Board
30	of Governors of The University of North Carolina. The State Board of Education shall
31	meet with the State Board of Community Colleges and the Board of Governors of The
32	University of North Carolina at least once a year to discuss educational matters of
33	mutual interest and to recommend to the General Assembly such policies as are
34	appropriate to encourage the improvement of public education at every level in this
35	State. The meeting in 1987 and every three years thereafter shall be hosted by the
36	University Board of Governors, the meeting in 1988 and every three years thereafter
37	shall be hosted by the State Board of Education, and the meeting in 1989 and every
38	three years thereafter shall be hosted by the State Board of Community Colleges.
39	(c) Special Meetings. – Special meetings of the Board may be set at any regular
40	meeting or may be called by the chairman or by the secretary upon the approval of the
41	chairman: Provided, a special meeting shall be called by the chairman upon the request
42	of any five members of the Board. In case of regular meetings and special meetings, the

1 must be deposited in the Raleigh Post Office at least three days prior to the date of2 meeting.

3 (d) Voting. – No voting by proxy shall be permitted. Except in voting on 4 textbook adoptions, all voting shall be viva voce unless a record vote or secret ballot is 5 demanded by any member, and a majority of those present and voting shall be necessary 6 to carry a motion.

7 (e) Voting on Adoption of Textbooks. – A majority vote of the whole
8 membership of the Board shall be required to adopt textbooks, and a roll call vote shall
9 be had on each motion for such adoption or adoptions. A record of all such votes shall
10 be kept in the minute book.

11 (f) Committees. – The Board may create from its membership such committees 12 as it deems necessary to facilitate its business. The chairman of the Board shall with 13 approval of the majority of the Board appoint members to the several committees 14 authorized by the Board and to any additional committees which the chairman may 15 deem to be appropriate.

16 (g) Record of Proceedings. – All of the proceedings of the Board shall be 17 recorded in a well-bound and suitable book, which shall be kept in the office of the 18 Superintendent of Public Instruction, and open to public inspection.

19 (h) Rules and Regulations. - The Board shall adopt reasonable rules and 20 regulations not inconsistent herewith, to govern its proceedings which the Board may 21 amend from time to time, which rules and regulations shall become effective when filed 22 as provided by law: Provided, however, a motion to suspend the rules so adopted shall require a consent of two thirds of the members. The rules and regulations shall include, 23 24 but not be limited to, clearly defined procedures for electing the officers of the State 25 Board referred to in G.S. 115C-11(a), fixing the term of said officers, specifying how 26 the voting shall be carried out, and establishing a date when the first election shall be 27 held."

28 Sec. 2. Service of the State Teacher of the Year as advisory member to the 29 State Board shall begin with the teacher who is named State Teacher of the Year for 30 1989-90.

31 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
