5	The General Ass	sembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Sectio	n 1. G.S. 143-166.3 reads as rewritten:

8	(a) When	any law-enforcement officer, fireman, rescue squad worker or senior
9	Civil Air Patrol	member shall be killed in the line of duty, the Industrial Commission
10	shall award a de	eath benefit to be paid in the amounts set forth in subsection (b) to the
11	following:	
12	(1)	The spouse of such officer, fireman, rescue squad worker or senior
13		Civil Air Patrol member if there be a surviving spouse; or
14	(2)	If there be no spouse qualifying under the provisions of this Article,
15		then payments shall be made to any surviving dependent child of such
16		officer, fireman, rescue squad worker or senior Civil Air Patrol
17		member and if there be more than one surviving dependent child, then
18		said payment shall be made to and equally divided among all surviving
19		dependent children; or
20	(3)	If there be no spouse and no dependent child or children qualifying
21		under the provisions of this Article, then payments shall be made to the
22		surviving dependent parent of such officer, fireman, rescue squad
23		worker or senior Civil Air Patrol member and if there be more than
24		one surviving dependent parent then said payments shall be made to

2	officer, fireman, rescue squad worker or senior Civil Air Patrol

4	(b) Payment shall be made to the person or persons qualifying therefor under	
5	subsection (a) in the following amounts:	
6	(1) At the time of the death of an officer, fireman, rescue squad worker or	
7	senior Civil Air Patrol member, ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)-twenty	
8	thousand dollars (\$20,000) shall be paid to the person or persons	
9	entitled thereto.	
10	(2) Thereafter, five thousand dollars (\$5,000) ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)	
11	shall be paid annually to the person or persons entitled thereto until the	
12	sum of the initial payment and each annual payment reaches twenty-	
13	five thousand dollars (\$25,000) fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).	
14	(3) In the event there is no person qualifying under subsection (a) of this	
15	section, twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) fifty thousand dollars	
16	<u>\$50,000</u> shall be paid to the estate of the deceased officer, fireman,	
17	rescue squad worker or senior Civil Air Patrol member at the time of	
18	death.	
19	(c) In the event that any person or persons eligible for payments under subsection
