A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ADD AN ADDITIONAL RESIDENT SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE IN
SUPERIOR COURT DISTRICT ELEVEN AND THIRTEEN.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 7A-41(a) reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-41. Superior court divisions and districts; judges.

(a) The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior court districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of regular resident superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of less than a whole county, as set out in subsection (b) of this section:

16 Sec. 2. G.S. 7A-41(d)(19) reads as rewritten:

17 "(19) In the eleventh superior court district, Wiley F. Bowen serves a term expiring
18 December 31, 1990. In the eleventh superior court district, the second judge shall be
19 appointed by the Governor to serve a term beginning January 1, 1990 and shall serve
20 until December 31, 1990. A successor shall be elected in the 1990 election."

21 Sec. 3. G.S. 7A-41(d)(23) reads as rewritten:

22 "(23) In the thirteenth superior court district, Giles R. Clark serves a term expiring
23 December 31, 1994. In the thirteenth superior court district, the second judge shall be
24 elected in 1990 to serve an initial four-year term expiring December 31, 1994.
25 Thereafter the term shall be for eight years."

26 Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative
27 Office of the Courts the sum of sixty-two thousand eight hundred five dollars (\$62,805)
28 for the 1989-90 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred sixty-eight thousand five dollars
29 (\$68,005) for the 1990-91 fiscal year to implement the provisions of this act.

30 Sec. 5. Section 1 of this act shall become effective January 1, 1990. Sections
31 2 and 3 of this act shall become effective upon ratification. Section 4 shall become
32 effective July 1, 1989.
