1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CREATE THE YOUTH SUICIDE ADVISORY BOARD AND TO
3	APPROPRIATE FUNDS THEREFOR.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Chapter 143B, Article 3 of the General Statutes is amended by
6	adding a new Part 4A to read as follows:
7	"PART 4A. YOUTH SUICIDE ADVISORY BOARD.
8	" <u>§ 143B-150.1. Purpose.</u>
9	It is the expressed intent of this Part to make the prevention of youth suicide a
10	priority of this State and to establish the Youth Suicide Advisory Board as a means to
11	that end.
12	"§ 143B-150.2. Youth Suicide Advisory Board - creation, powers and duties.
13	There is hereby created the Youth Suicide Advisory Board to be located in the
14	Department of Human Resources. The Board shall have the following powers and
15	duties:
16	(a) To evaluate the existing system of delivery of State services in the prevention
17	of youth suicide and to recommend an improved system of delivery to meet present and
18	future needs.
19	(b) To seek the cooperation, advice, and assistance of both private and
20	governmental agencies, commissions, and organizations and work cooperatively with
21	other such groups to attain common goals.

1	(c) To e	ncourage private organizations and local governments to organize and
2		ctivities to increase public awareness of the problem of youth suicide.
3		serve as a clearinghouse for the collection and dissemination of
4		but youth suicide prevention plans and coordinate, generally, activities

9		. Youth Suicide Advisory Board - members; selection; meetings;

11	<u>(a) The</u>	Youth Suicide Advisory Board shall consist of 15 voting members, as
12	<u>follows:</u>	
13	<u>(1)</u>	Three members from State government: the Secretary of Human
14		Resources or his designate, the Superintendent of Public Instruction or
15		his designate, the Director of the Administrative Office of the Court or
16		his designate.
17	<u>(2)</u>	Four members appointed by the Governor from the following
18		categories: one shall be a local school board member, one shall be an
19		area mental health administrator, one shall be an expert in the field of
20		youth suicide, and one shall be a person under the age of 21 at the time
21		of the appointment.
22	<u>(3)</u>	Four members appointed by the President of the Senate from the
23		following categories: one shall be a classroom teacher, one shall be a
24		school administrator, one shall be a mental health clinician with
25		expertise in the area of youth suicide, and one shall be a member of a
26		parent-based organization.
27	<u>(4)</u>	Four members appointed by the Speaker of the House of
28		Representatives from the following categories: one shall be a student
29		services professional (school counselor, school psychologist, school
30		social worker, or school nurse), one shall be an expert in the field of
31		youth suicide, one shall be a member of the clergy, and one shall be a
32		representative of the news media.
33	<u>(b)</u> For a	continuity during the first term of the Board, each appointing authority
34		member of the Youth Suicide Study Commission to serve on the Board.
35	<u>(c) All n</u>	nembers shall serve for two-year terms. All initial terms shall begin July
36	<u>1, 1989.</u> A vac	ancy in membership shall be filled by the appointing authority who made

42		an of the Board shall be elected by the membership at its first meeting, to
43	be convened by	the Secretary of Human Resources.

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1	The Youth Suicide Advisory Board shall meet at least once each quarter and may
2	hold special meetings at any time at the call of its chairman.
3	A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
4	Members of the Board who are State employees shall receive travel expenses as set
5	forth in G.S. 138-6. The other Board members shall receive per diem and travel
6	expenses as set forth in G.S. 138-5.
7	Staff and support services required by the Board shall be provided by the Secretary
8	of Human Resources.
9	" <u>§ 143B-150.4. Youth Suicide Advisory Board - projects.</u>
10	In order to carry out the purposes of this Part the Board shall, with the assistance of
11	the Department of Human Resources and the Department of Public Instruction:
12	(a) Plan and host a statewide conference designed to emphasize the needs and
13	goals of a statewide action plan to address the problems and issues related to youth
14	suicide, which shall have as participants current and potential service providers,
15	including school administrators, student services professionals, teachers, mental health
16	professionals, and community organizations.
17	(b) Review applications and have final authority for the awarding of grants
18	pursuant to this Article.
19	(c) Analyze program plans developed by grant recipients and make
20	recommendations to the General Assembly for future funding of programs.
21	(d) Develop a State plan for the prevention of youth suicide for submission to the
22	Governor and the General Assembly no later than January 1, 1991.
23	" <u>§ 143B-150.5. Youth Suicide Advisory Board - planning grants.</u>
24	In order to ensure that the most effective prevention and crisis intervention programs
25	are developed and ultimately available statewide, the Board shall:
26	(a) Award eight planning grants in the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)
27 28	per grant, two each in the Western, North Central, South Central and Eastern Regions of the State, said Regions to be as designated by the Division of Montel Health, Montel
28 29	the State, said Regions to be as designated by the Division of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services.
29 30	(1) The grants may be awarded to public or private nonprofit
31	organizations, agencies, schools, or hospitals to assess community
32	needs and to develop community-based educational and service
33	programs designed to prevent the occurrence of youth suicide.
34	(2) Grants awarded under this section are intended to encourage the
35	development of community-based programs for the prevention of
36	youth suicide. Youth suicide prevention programs are defined to be
37	those programs and services which impact on children and families
38	both before and after any substantiated incident of suicidal behavior
39	has occurred. Such programs shall include, but are not limited to:
40	<u>a.</u> Instruction or materials designed to teach facts about youth
41	suicide and how to recognize signs of suicidal tendencies; to
42	publicize available community services aimed at prevention of

1 <u>After submitting the comprehensive report, the Board shall submit an annual</u> 2 <u>report to the Governor and the General Assembly.</u>"

3 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 4 Human Resources the sum of one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) for

- 5 the 1989-91 fiscal biennium to fund the Youth Suicide Advisory Board, and to
- 6 implement the activities mandated by this act.
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Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.

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
