Sec. 2. Funds raised from the increase in fees enacted in Section 1 of this act shall be used by the North Carolina State Board of Opticians for the employment of a person to investigate violations of Article 17, Chapter 90 of the General Statutes. Sec. 3. G.S. 90-240 reads as rewritten: **"§ 90-240. Examination.** Applicants to take the examination for dispensing opticians shall be high school graduates or the equivalent who:

accredited school of opticianry with a minimum of 1600 hours or (2) Have completed three and one-half years of apprenticeship while registered with the Board under a licensed dispensing optician, with

time spent in a recognized school credited as part of the apprenticeship period or

(3) Have completed three and one-half years of apprenticeship while registered with the Board under the direct supervision of an optometrist or a physician specializing in ophthalmology, provided the optometrist or physician elects to operate the apprenticeship under the same requirements applicable to dispensing opticians.

- The examination shall be confined to such knowledge as is reasonably (b) necessary to engage in preparation and dispensing of optical devices and shall include the following:
 - (1) The skills necessary for the proper analysis of prescriptions;
 - The skills necessary for the dispensing of eyeglasses and contact (2) lenses; and
 - The processes by which the products offered by dispensing opticians (3) are manufactured.
- Applicants for licensure as dispensing opticians, and dispensing opticians who obtained licensure after July 1, 1985, may not engage in the dispensing of contact lenses unless such applicant or dispensing optician has passed an examination relating to the dispensing of contact lenses or has qualified for a waiver under G.S. 90-241(a). The examination relating to the dispensing of contact lenses shall include the following:
 - The skills necessary for the proper analysis of prescriptions for contact (1) lenses:
 - **(2)** The skills necessary for the dispensing of contact lenses;
 - Proper care and maintenance of the various types of contact lenses (3) available through dispensing opticians; and
 - The processes by which the products offered by dispensing opticians (4) are manufactured.
- The examination-Examinations shall be given at least twice each year at sites and on dates that are publicly announced 60 days in advance.
- Each applicant shall, upon request, receive his or her examination score on each section of the each examination.
