- 1 (5) Any other person exempted by regulation of the Wildlife Resources 2 Commission. 3 (d) The Wildlife Resources Commission shall: Adopt regulations that establish the criteria for a course of instruction 4 (1) 5 in boating safety education: 6 Administer a verbal test when appropriate: <u>(2)</u> Coordinate a statewide program of boating safety instruction and 7 (3) 8 certification and ensure that a course in boating safety education is 9 available in each county; and Ensure that a course in boating safety education is available at the 10 (4) 11 earliest practicable age for children in boating communities. 12 Any person or entity may offer a course of instruction in boating safety education if approved by the Wildlife Resources Commission, including the following: 13 14 the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary; the U.S. Power Squadron; a political subdivision; a 15 municipal corporation; a State agency; a public or nonpublic school. The Wildlife Resources Commission or its designee shall 16 (f) (1) 17 issue a certificate of boating safety education to a person who passes 18 a course prescribed by the Commission or who passes a boating equivalency examination administered by persons authorized to offer 19 20 a course in boating safety education. Upon request, the Commission 21 will provide, without charge, boating safety education materials to persons who plan to take the boating safety equivalency 22 23 examination. 24 Once issued, a certificate of boating safety education is valid for the (2) lifetime of the person to whom the certificate was issued, and may not 25 26 be revoked by the Commission or by a court of law. The Commission shall replace, without charge, a lost or destroyed certificate if the 27 Commission issued the certificate or has a record that a certificate was 28 issued by the U.S. Coast Guard or the U.S. Power Squadron. 29 30 The Wildlife Resources Commission or its designee may issue a 30-day (g) temporary certificate of boating safety education to a person who signs an affidavit 31 32 stating that the person has read and understood the boating safety education materials 33 provided by the Commission. Upon request, the temporary certificate may be renewed for one additional 30-day period. 34 (h) In lieu of a certificate of boating safety education issued by the Wildlife 35 Resources Commission, a license issued by the U.S. Coast Guard, a boating safety 36 certificate issued by a unit of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, the U.S. Power Squadron, 37 38 or a local board of education, or a boating safety certificate issued in another state in accordance with criteria of the National Association of State Boating Law 39
 - Sec. 2. G.S. 75A-18 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(e) Any person who violates any provision of G.S 75A-15.1 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable upon a first conviction by a fine not to exceed twenty-five

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- 1 <u>dollars (\$25.00)</u> and upon subsequent convictions occurring within two years of a prior
- 2 conviction by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00)."
