A JOINT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH
 COMMISSION TO STUDY HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL.

Whereas, the provision of adequate treatment and disposal facilities for hazardous waste is of major importance to continued economic growth and environmental integrity of the State; and

Whereas, North Carolina has no hazardous waste disposal facilities; and

7 Whereas, the siting of a hazardous waste facility has met with intense 8 opposition in each of the local communities that have been proposed as a site for a 9 hazardous waste facility; and

10 Whereas, incineration is one method that has been proposed for the treatment 11 of hazardous waste in the State to meet federally mandated capacity assurance 12 requirements; and

Whereas, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is currently using
mobile incinerators to treat hazardous wastes on site;

15 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:

16 Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study the issue of 17 hazardous waste treatment and disposal in North Carolina. As a part of this study, the 18 Commission may study the issue of incineration as a method of hazardous waste 19 treatment, including the use of mobile incinerators, to resolve the problem of hazardous

20 waste treatment and disposal in the State.

- 1 Sec. 2. The Legislative Research Commission may make an interim report to
- the 1992 Session of the 1991 General Assembly and shall make a final report to the1993 General Assembly.
- 4 Sec. 3. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
